Foreign Language in Elementary Schools (FLES):

FLES is a unique and exciting program offering children the opportunity to expand their cultural horizons by learning a foreign language. Our one-hour classes in French, Spanish and Mandarin Chinese meet weekly, before or after school from October through May according to the MCPS calendar. Native speakers from around the globe teach fun, lively classes where children talk, play-act, imitate, play games and sing – all in the foreign language! Students may begin FLES classes in Kindergarten and follow the sequential curriculum through 6th grade.
