Recruiting Members versus Recruiting Volunteers

Remember that membership recruitment is different from volunteer recruitment. When recruiting members, emphasize the importance of belonging to a large organization that advocates for all children. Change your appeal slightly to encourage the involvement and active participation of parents in the work of PTA. And make sure you ask as many potential volunteers as you can possibly reach. Don't assume anyone will step up without your personal and enthusiastic encouragement.

Communication is Key – Join E-Lists

As we cut back on copying expenses (along with MCPS!), it is all the more critical that PTA leaders and members join the appropriate MCCPTA e-lists.

Open to ALL (All PTA officers/members/etc.):

- MCCPTA_Bulletin – Official MCCPTA documents, announcements, and notices. *All Presidents and Delegates should join.*
- MCCPTA_Delegates – Pending resolutions for discussion, school or education issues for discussion. *All Delegates should join.*

For Presidents/Vice Presidents/AVPs/Cluster Coordinators:

- MCCPTA_Presidents – Direct communication from the MCCPTA President to the local presidents. *All Presidents should join.*
- MCCPTA_Presidents_Discussion – Advice, suggestions, recommendations, issue-oriented discussion among local PTA presidents.

For Treasurers:

- MCCPTA_Treasurers – Treasurer-related issues and advice. *All treasurers should join.*

For High School Presidents:

- HS_PTSA_Presidents – Discussion among High School Presidents only.

There are additional committee-based e-lists as well. If you are interested in any particular committee's issues, contact the chair for information on how to join their e-list.

Going Green? Consider the True Costs

There's truly nothing like a piece of paper in hand to catch someone's attention. Yes, we want to be environmentally conscious, but our primary mission is to encourage parent involvement. Posting items on your website requires more initiative on the part of those you're trying to reach. Again, consider the needs and resources within your communities and ensure that you are communicating with them in the most effective manner....even if it means a few reams of paper!

Being a Delegate

Welcome to new and returning delegates! Our first Delegates' Assembly is Tuesday, September 27, 7:30, in the Carver Auditorium.

A few things to know about Delegates Assemblies:

- Delegates' Assemblies are held the 4th Tuesday of every month at 7:30pm (except in December).
- Many Delegates' Assemblies will be preceded by a special program of interest.
- Each local PTA is entitled to 3 voting members of the Delegates Assembly (the President and 2 delegates).
- Can't make every meeting? The PTA can name alternate delegates.
- Check your local PTA bylaws on whether your delegates are elected or appointed.
- Once your PTA begins submitting dues payments, your PTA will receive 3 voting cards.
- Delegates represent the position of their local PTA membership at the Delegates Assemblies.
- There is one vote per delegate, even if you represent more than one school.
- Delegates can make or amend motions without prior direction from their local PTA membership.
- Stay up-to-date on all issues by subscribing to the Delegate e-list and come to the Delegates Assemblies informed and ready to vote on behalf of your school.

A special note on delegate's voting cards:

If you are a new delegate, do try to obtain the delegate voting card from your predecessor. These cards are valid until November 1. We understand though that some previous delegates “disappear” and voting cards cannot be had. When that is the case, we will work on an honor system until November 1. We are in the process of reviewing new options for distributing the year's delegates cards. Just keep in mind that your PTA must first pay dues to MCCPTA (\$1 per member) in order to receive new delegate cards and look for more guidance in the months to come with regard to a new process for the distribution of delegate cards.

Membership is important to the health of every organization. Have a PTA membership table at EVERY school event all year!
