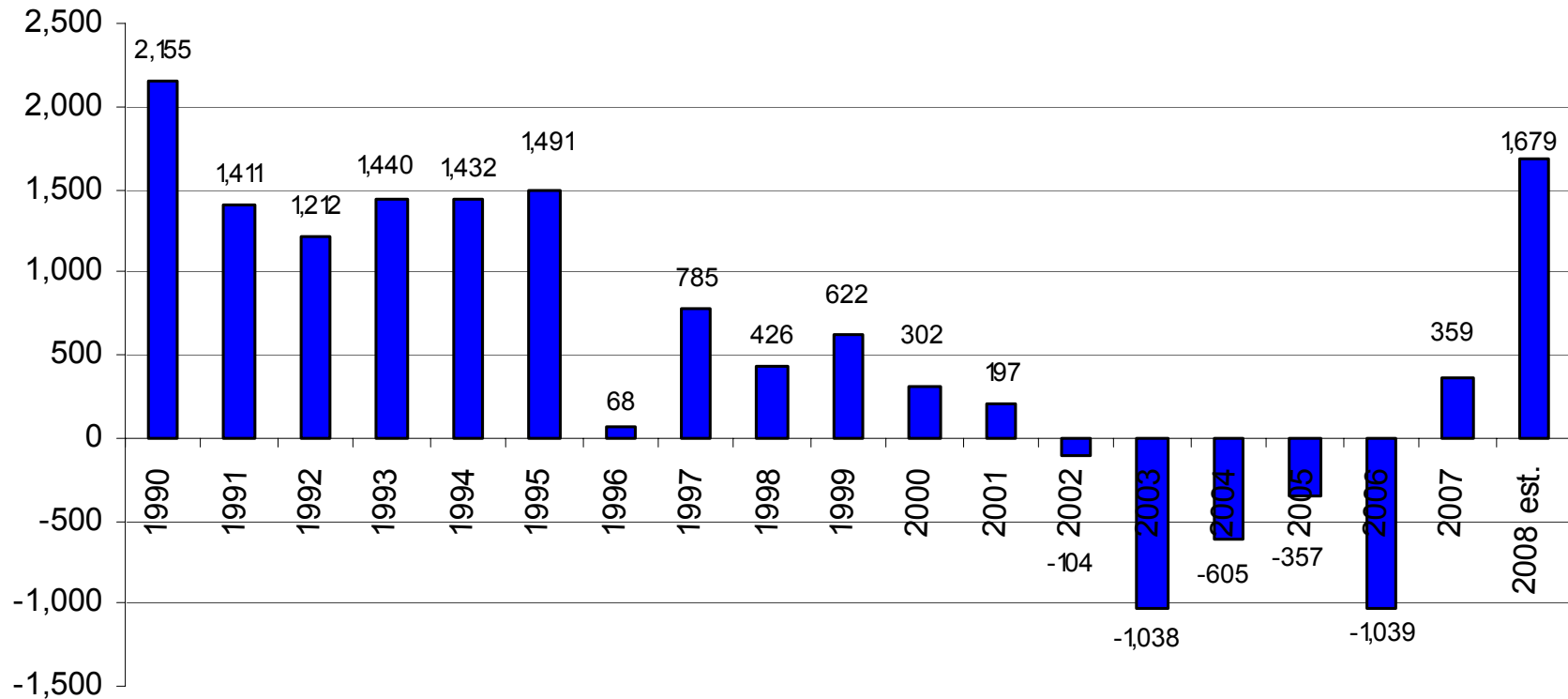

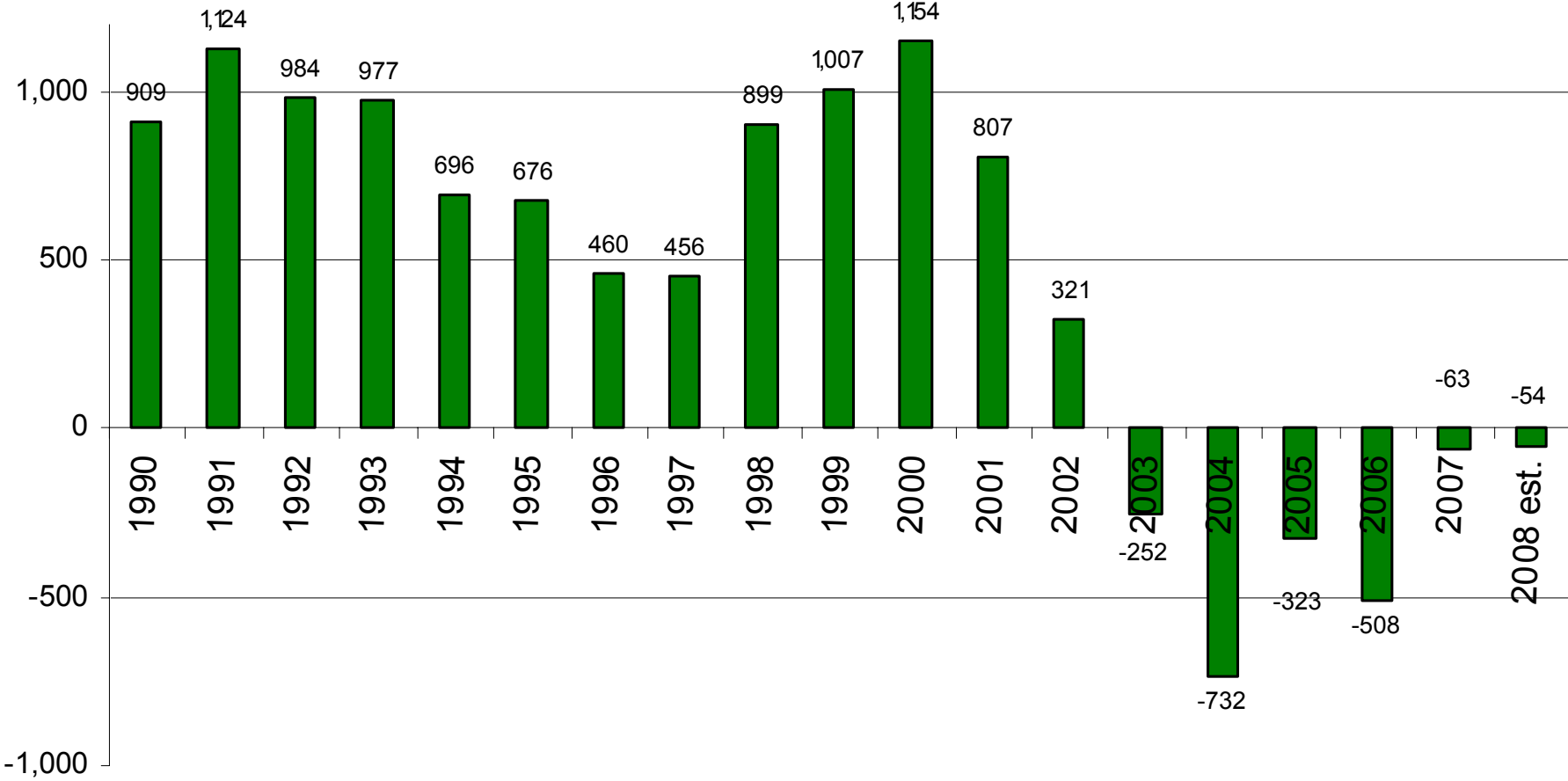

Annual Change in K-5 Enrollment: 1990 - 2008 est.



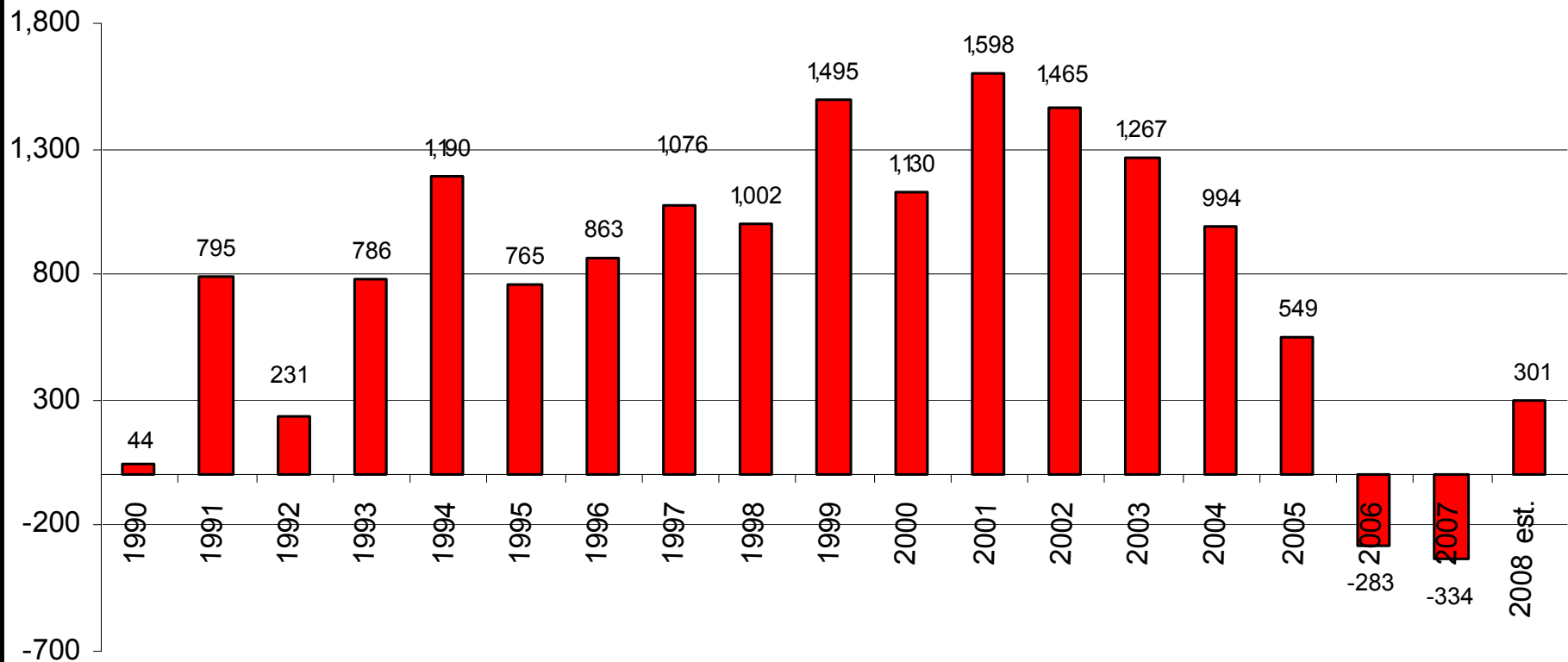

Annual Change in 6-8 Enrollment: 1990 - 2008 est.



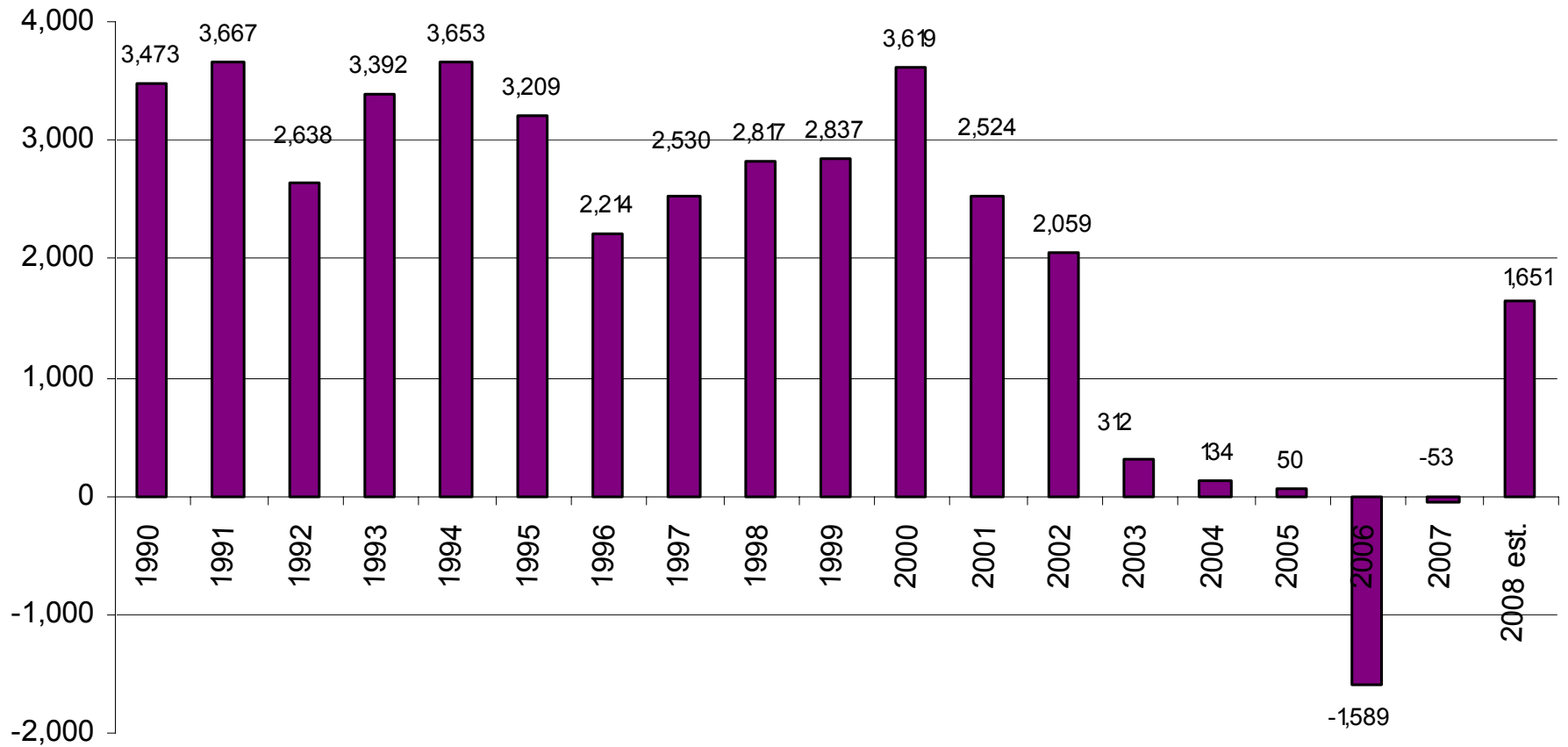

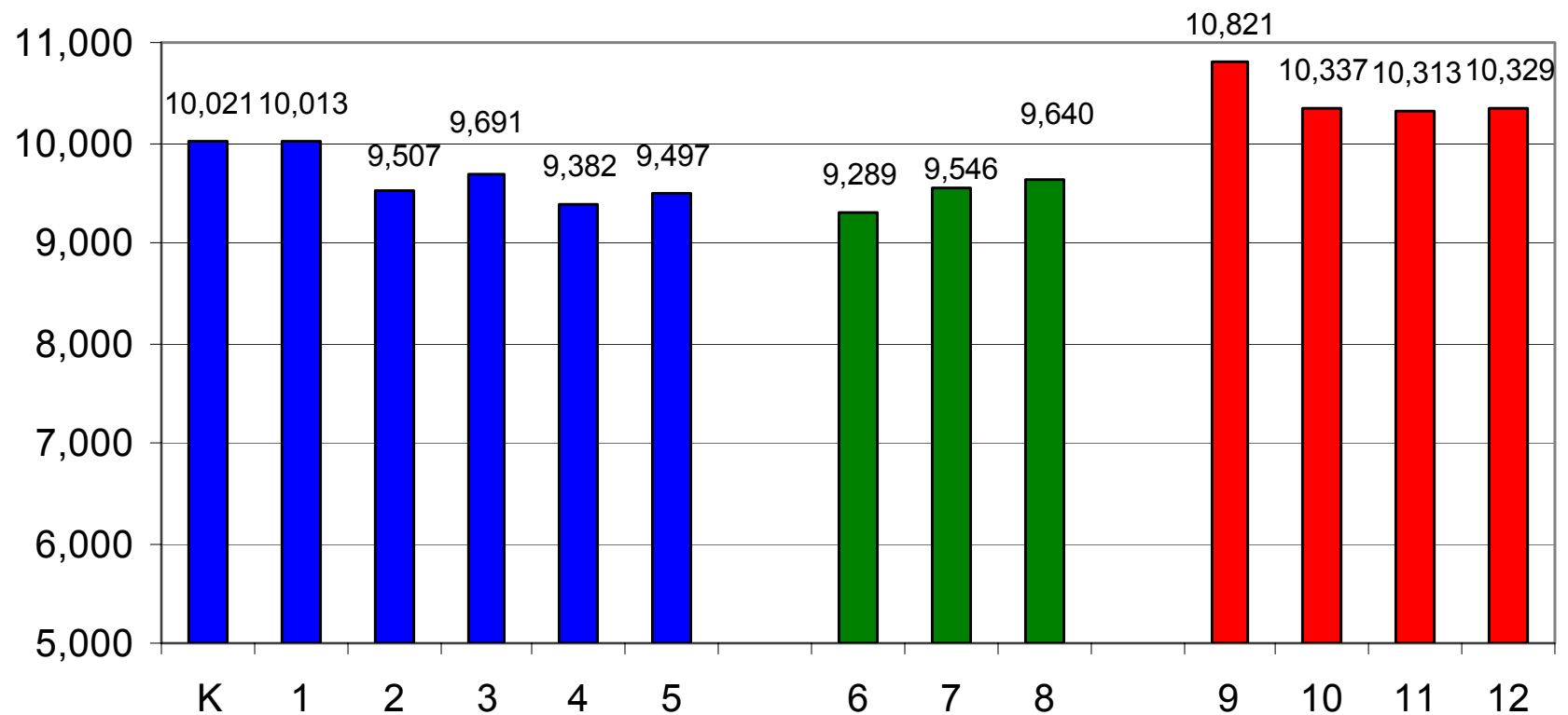
Annual Change in Total MCPS Enrollment: 1990-2008 est.





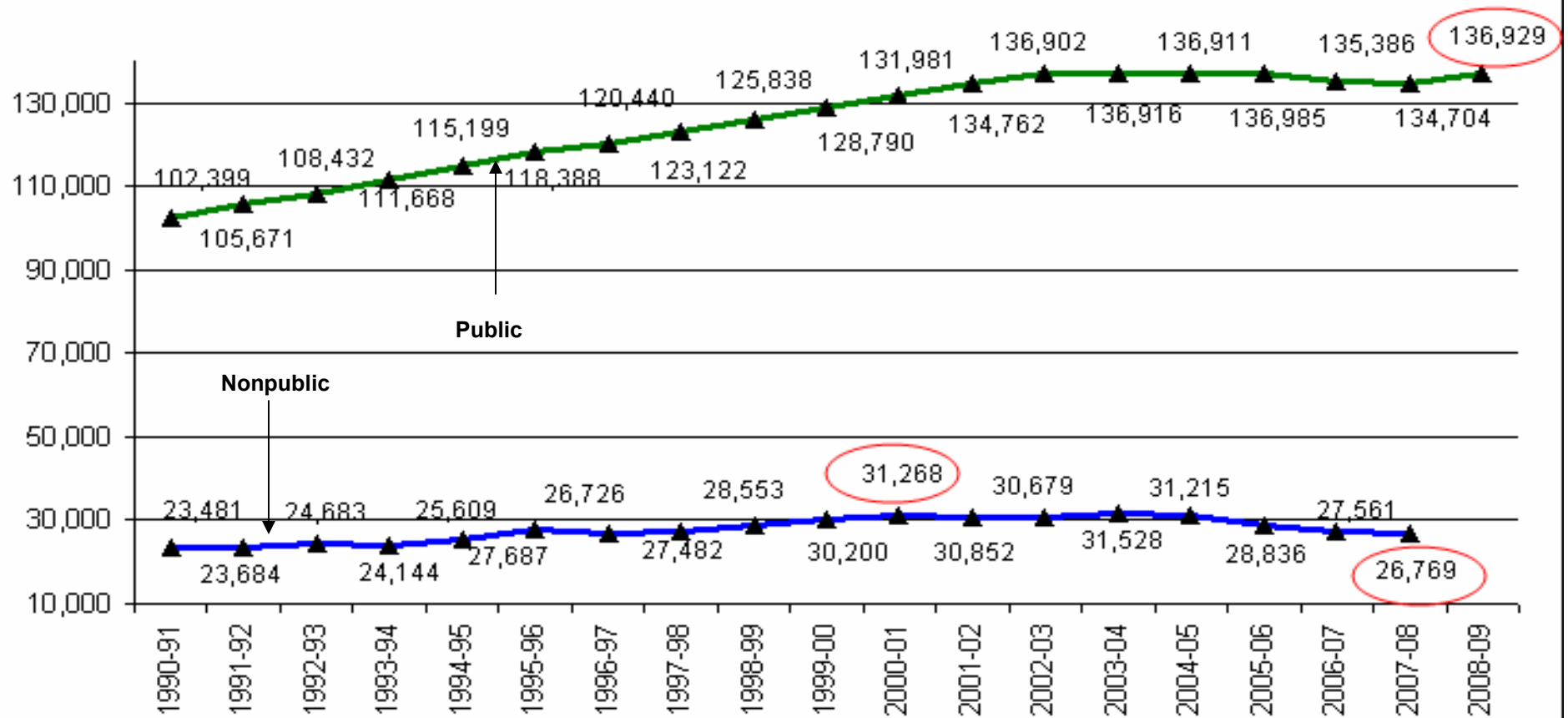

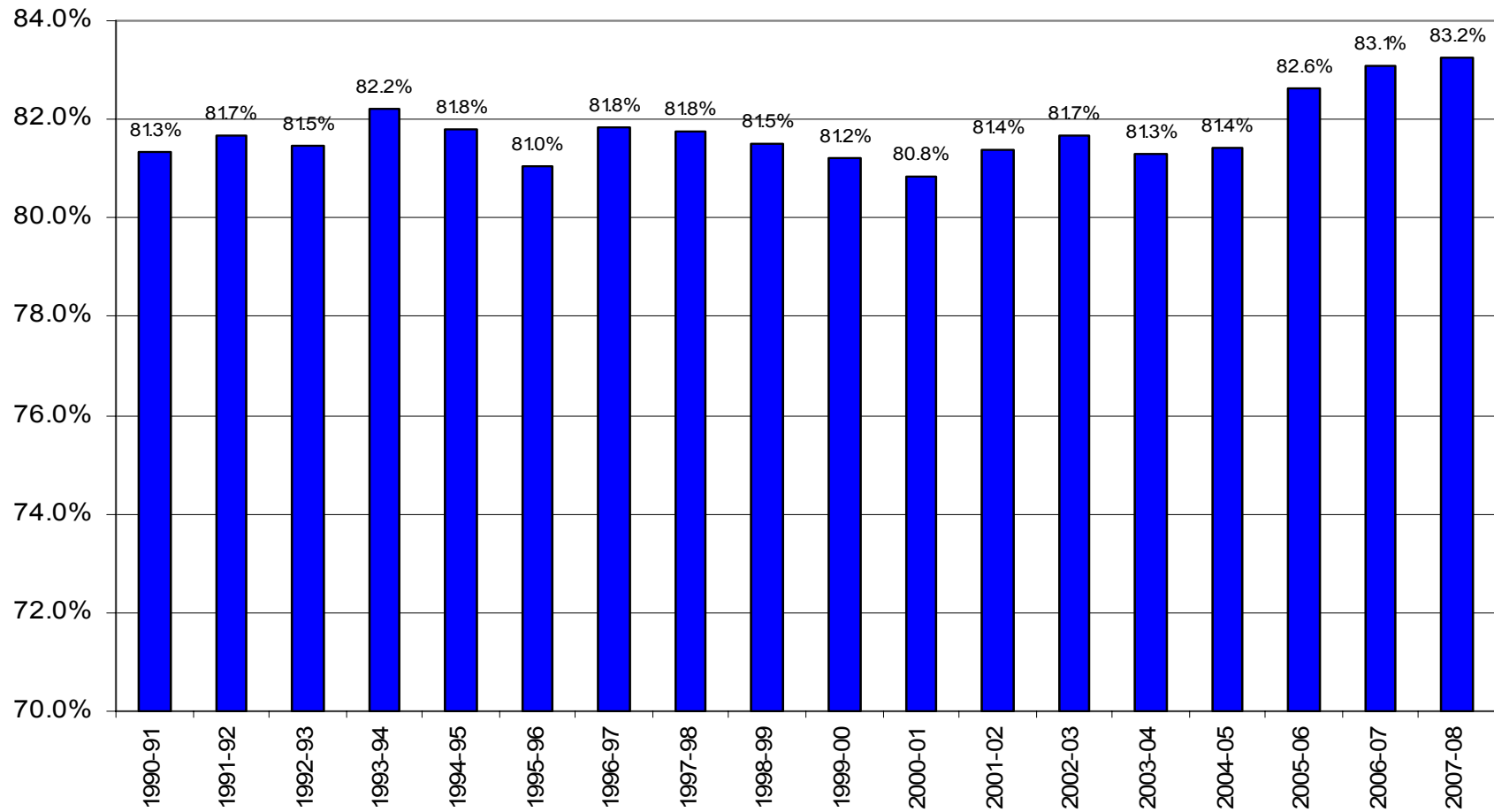
## MCPS and Montgomery County Nonpublic Enrollment

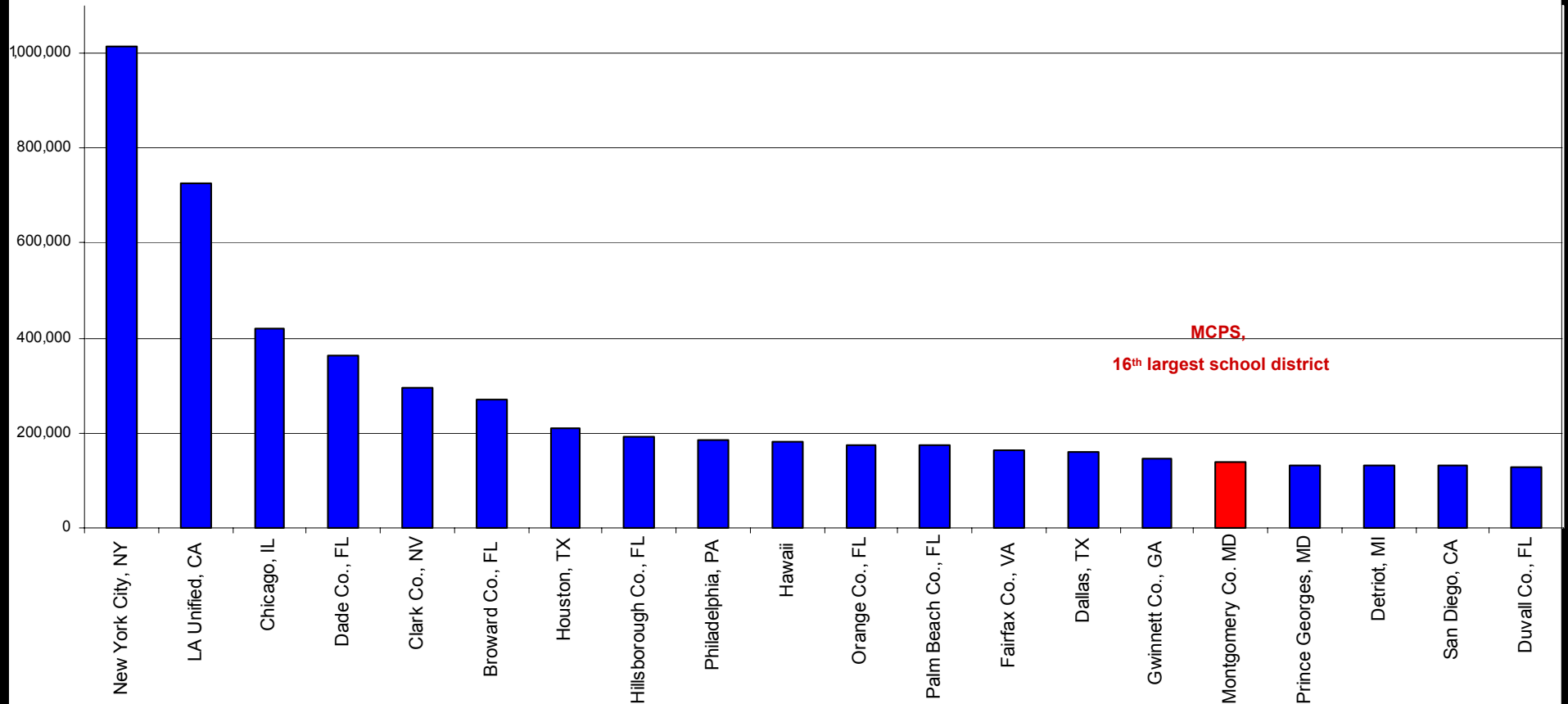

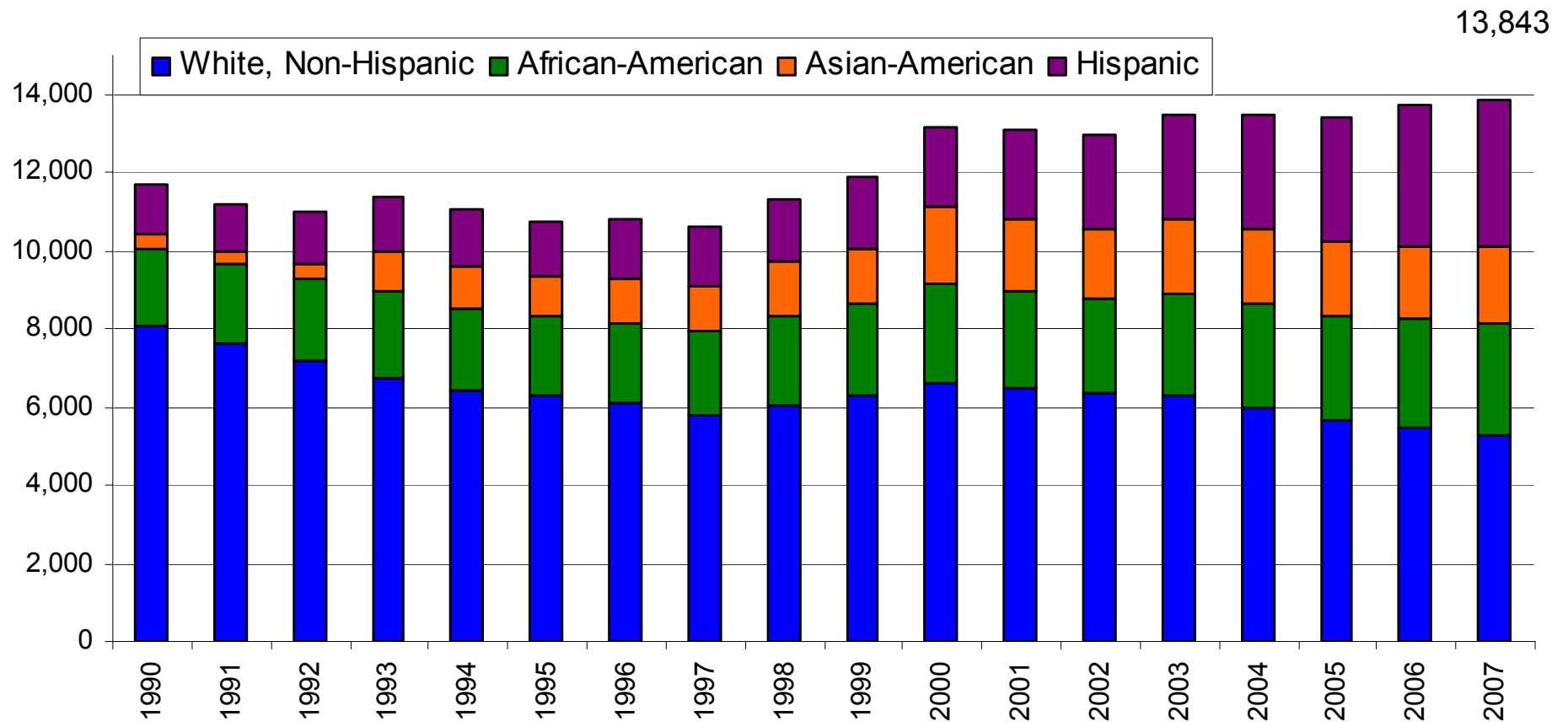

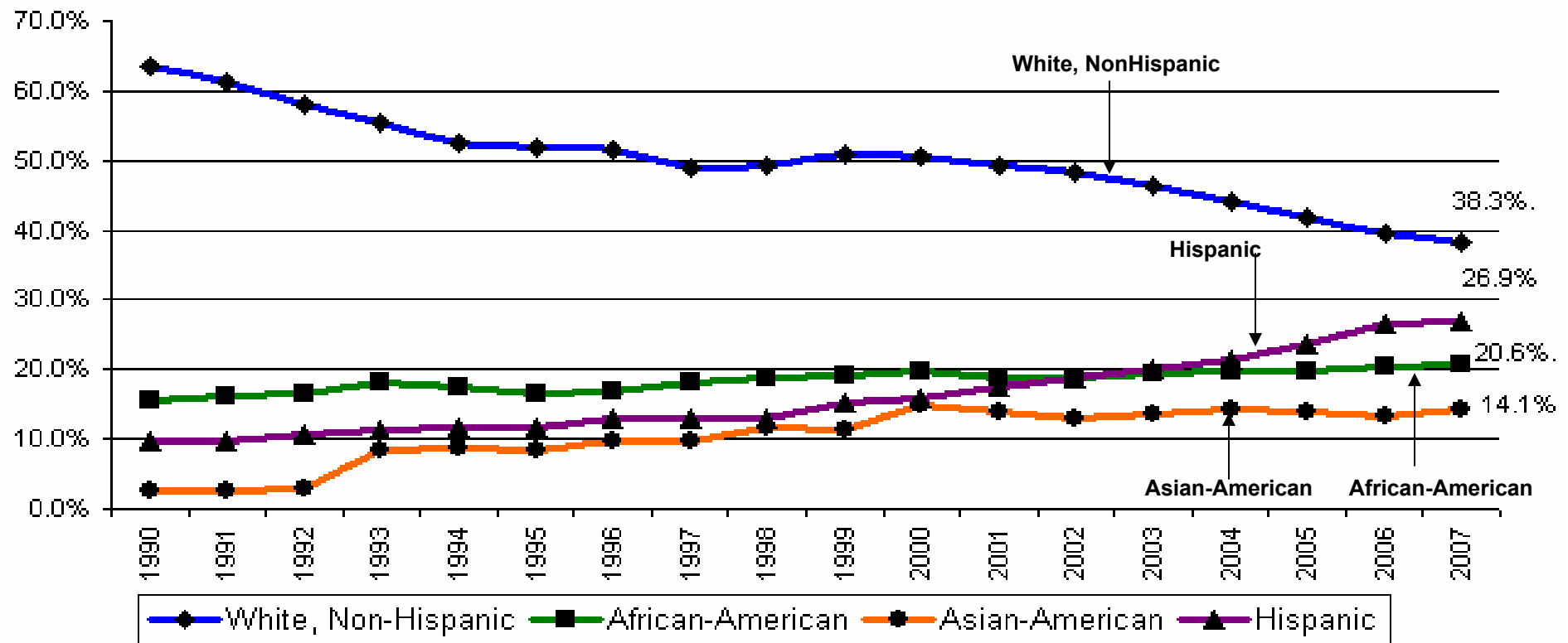

## Montgomery County Resident Births, by Race

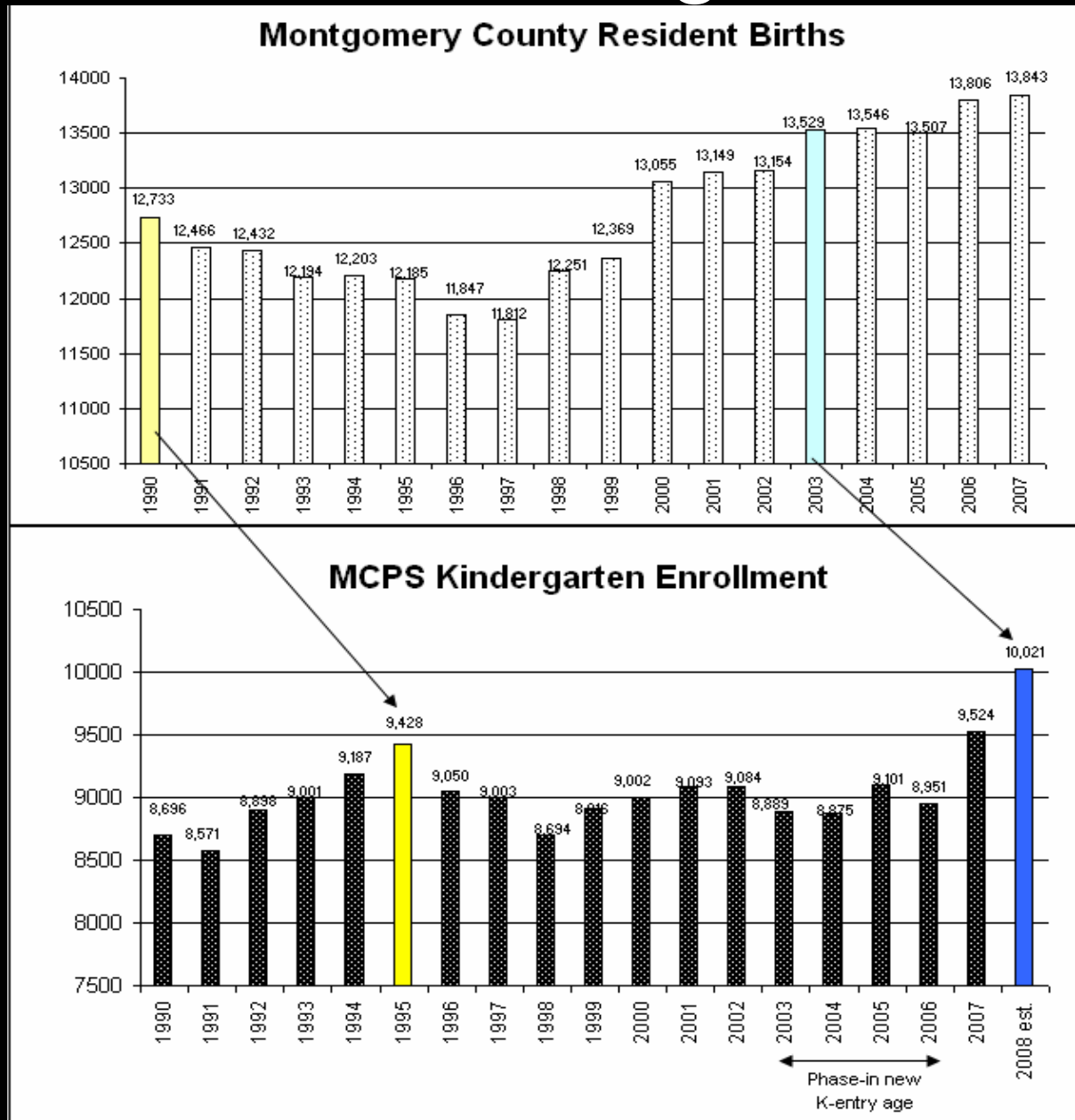

## Montgomery County Resident Births Race/ Ethnic Groups as Percent of Total Births

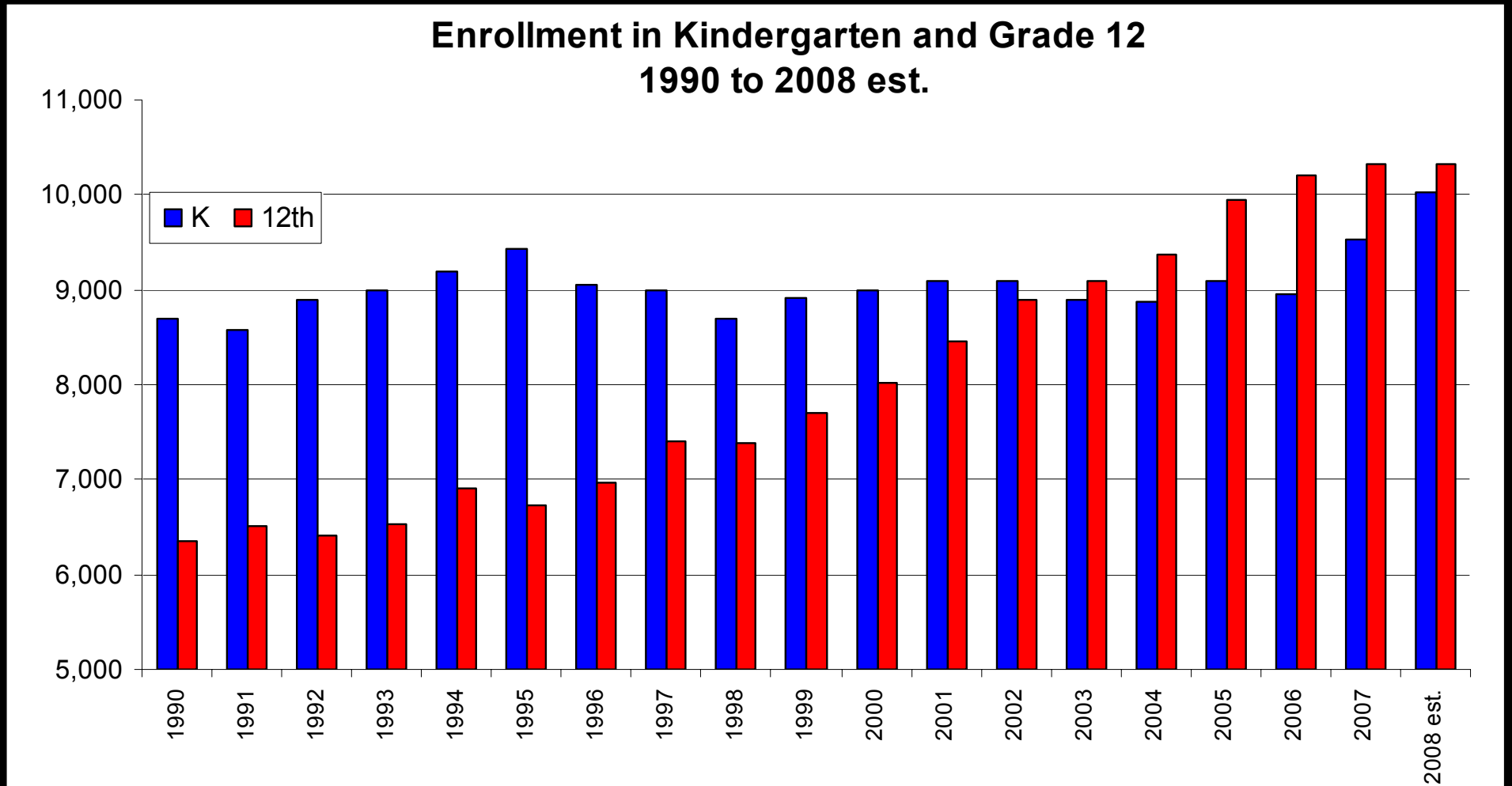

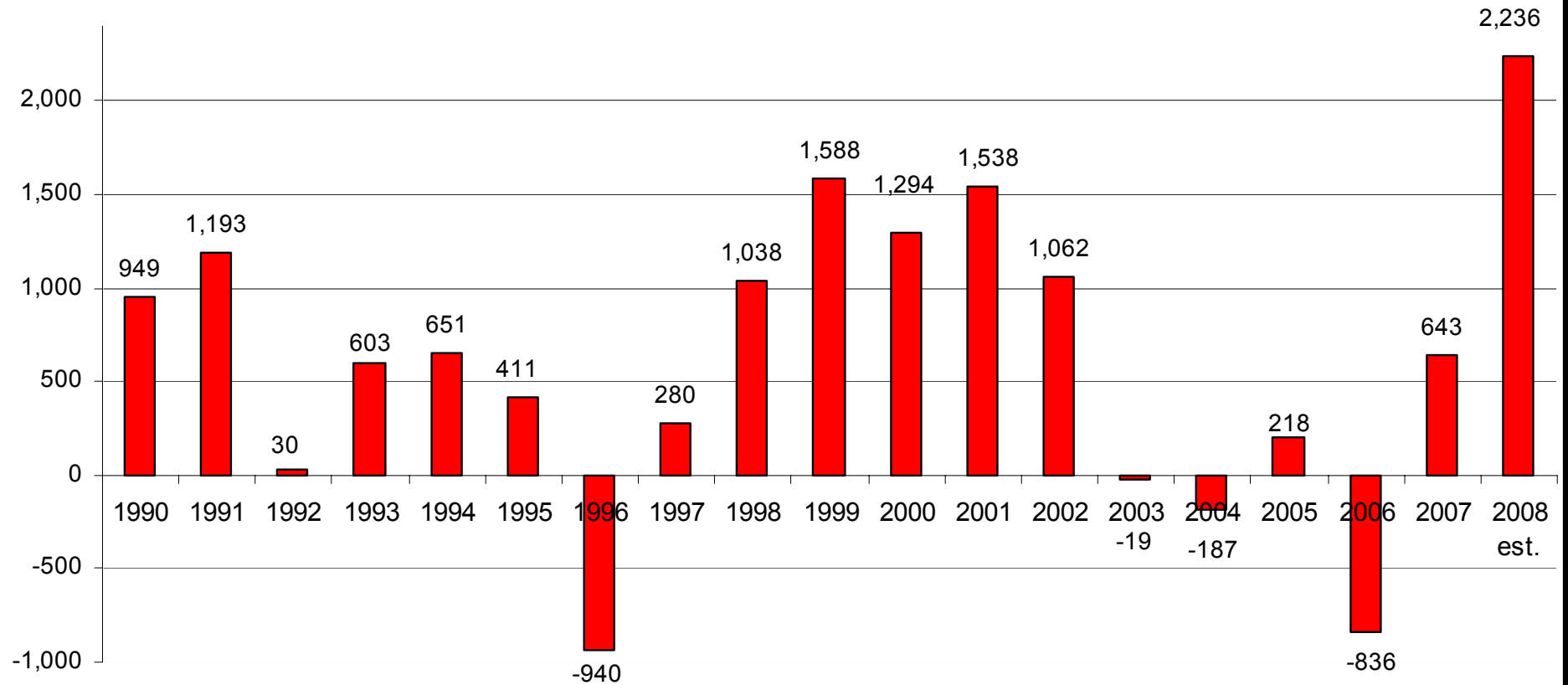

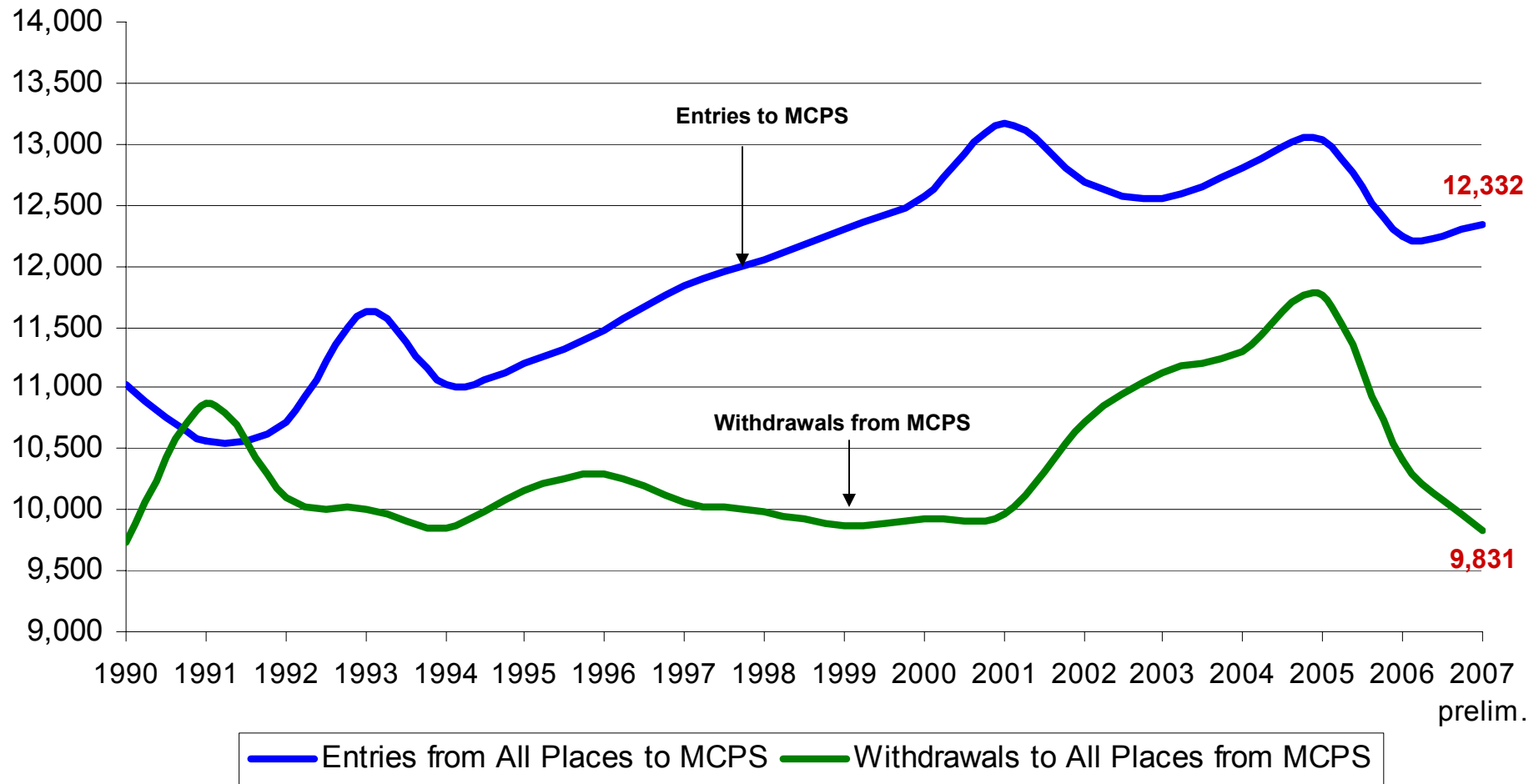

1990 to 2008 est.**



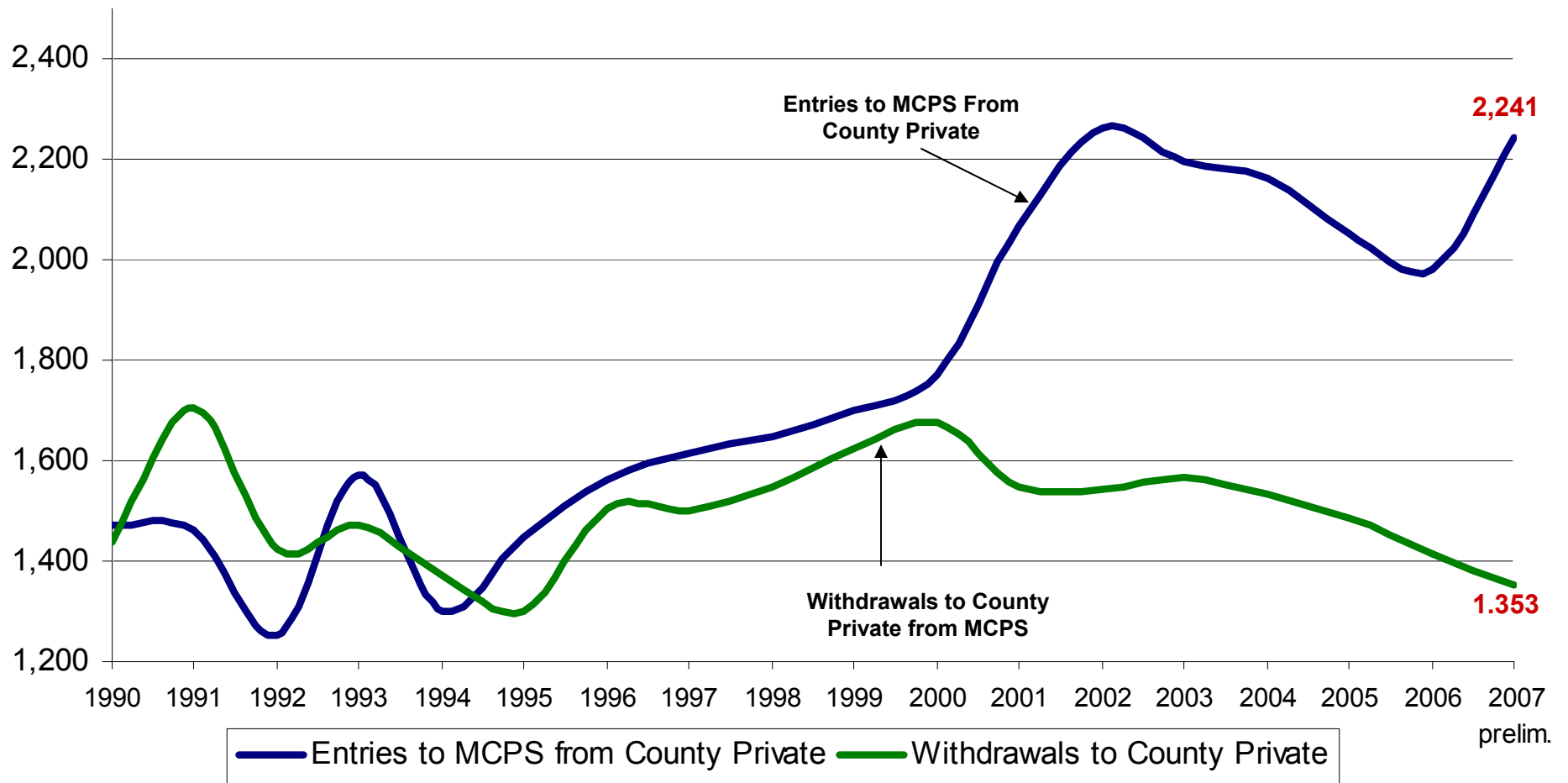

## Student Migration Patterns: Movement Into and Out Of MCPS



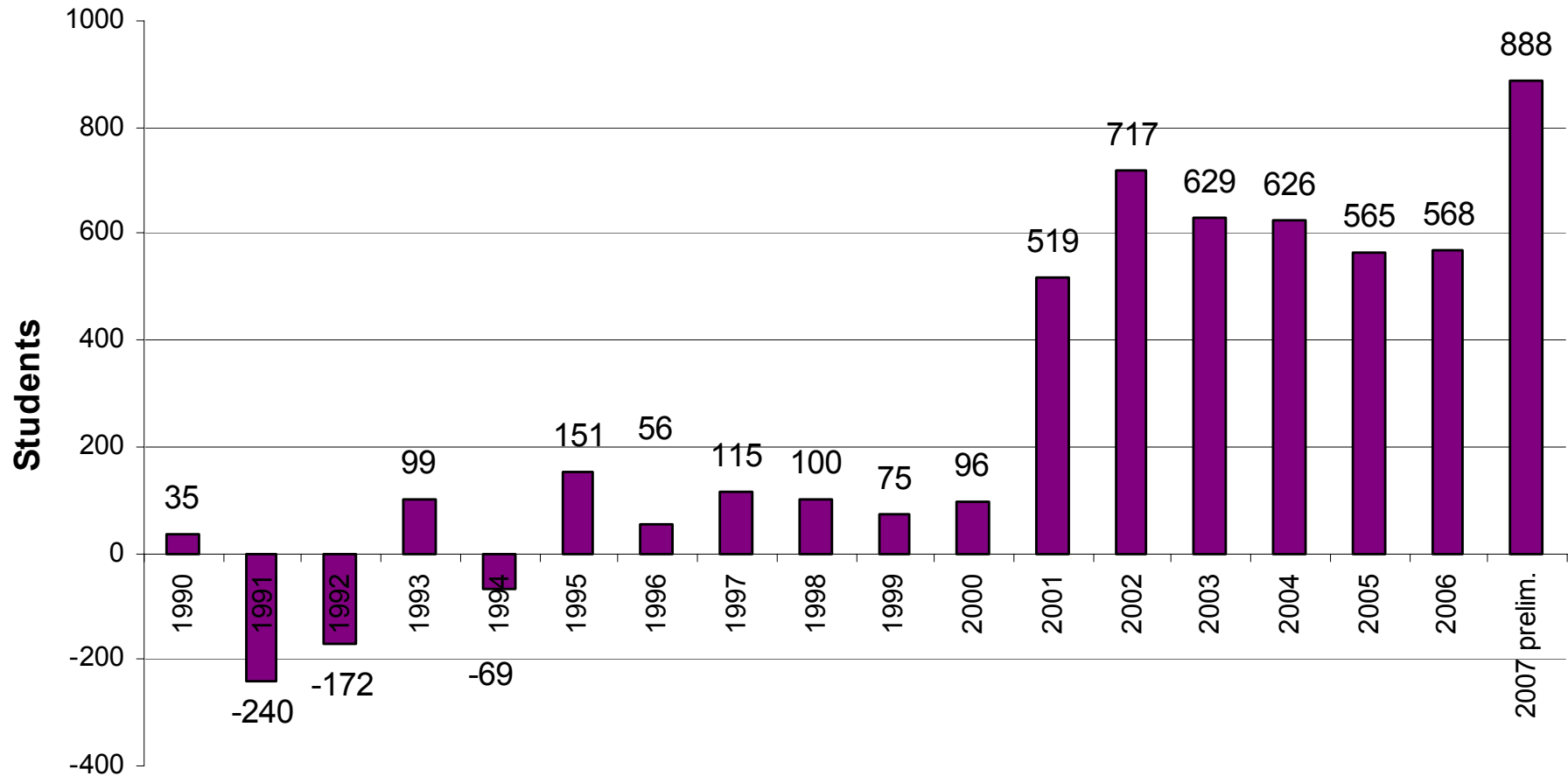

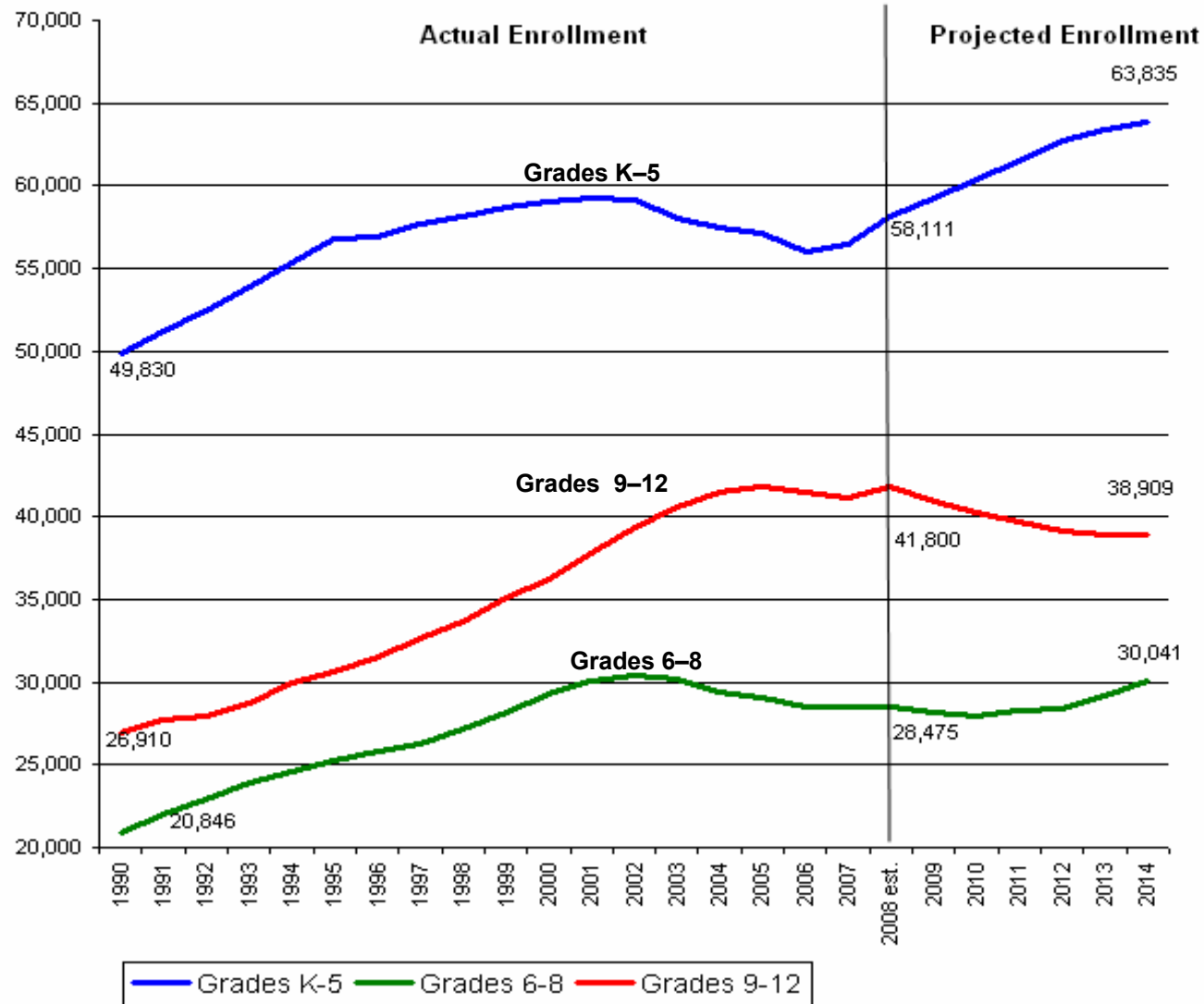
**Net Amount of MCPS Enrollment Change Due to Migration of Students from/ to County Private Schools**

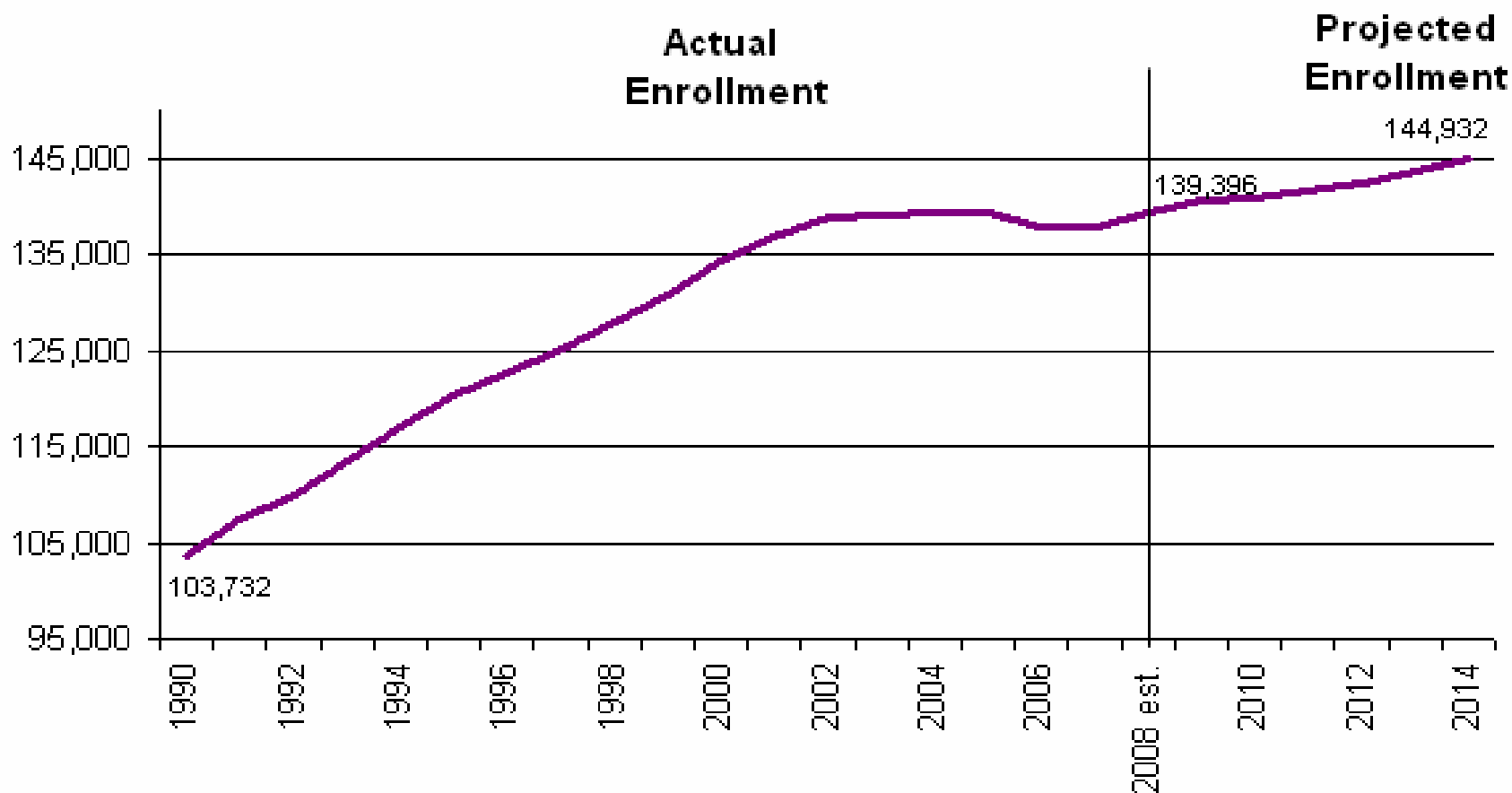

Actual 1980-2008 est. and Projected 2009–2014

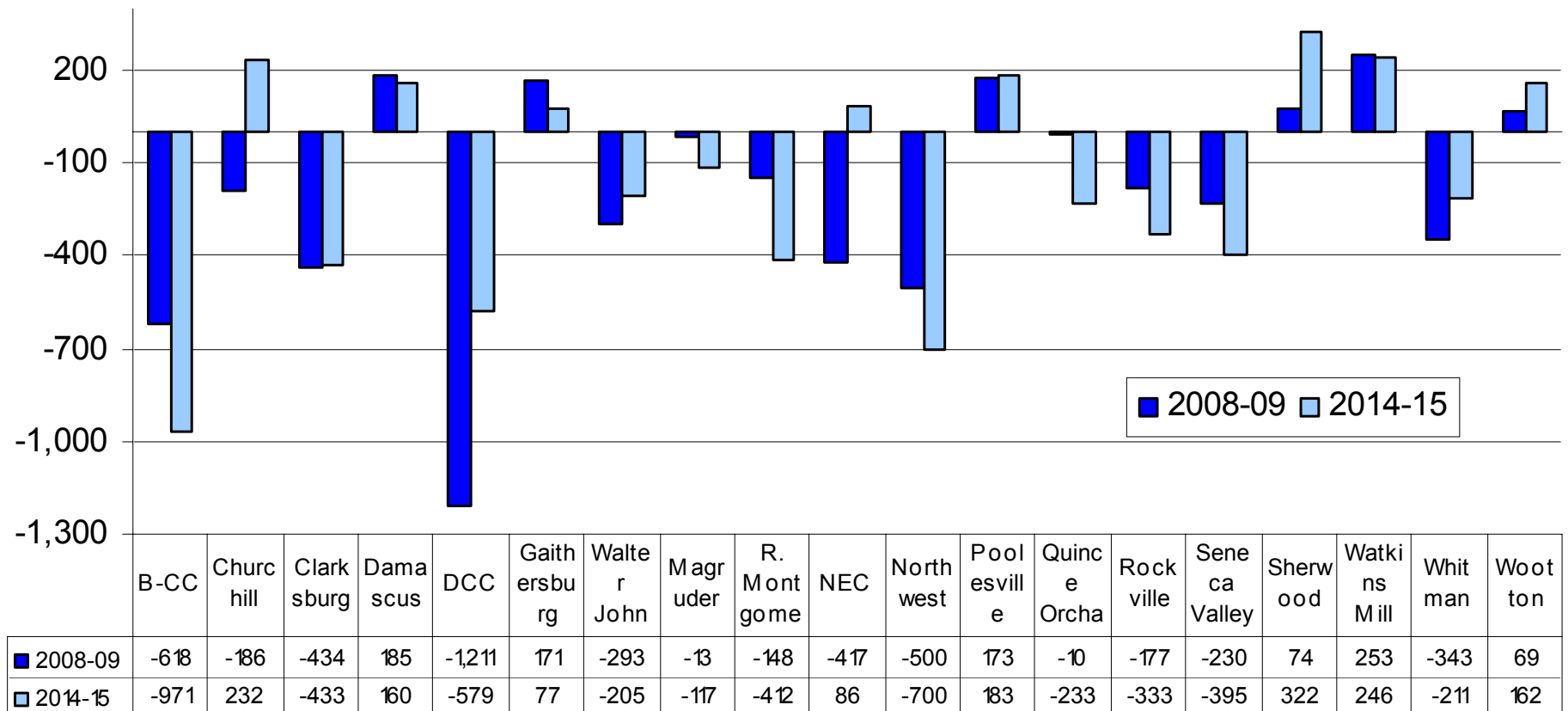

## Elementary Space Available/ Deficit, 2008-09 and 2014-15

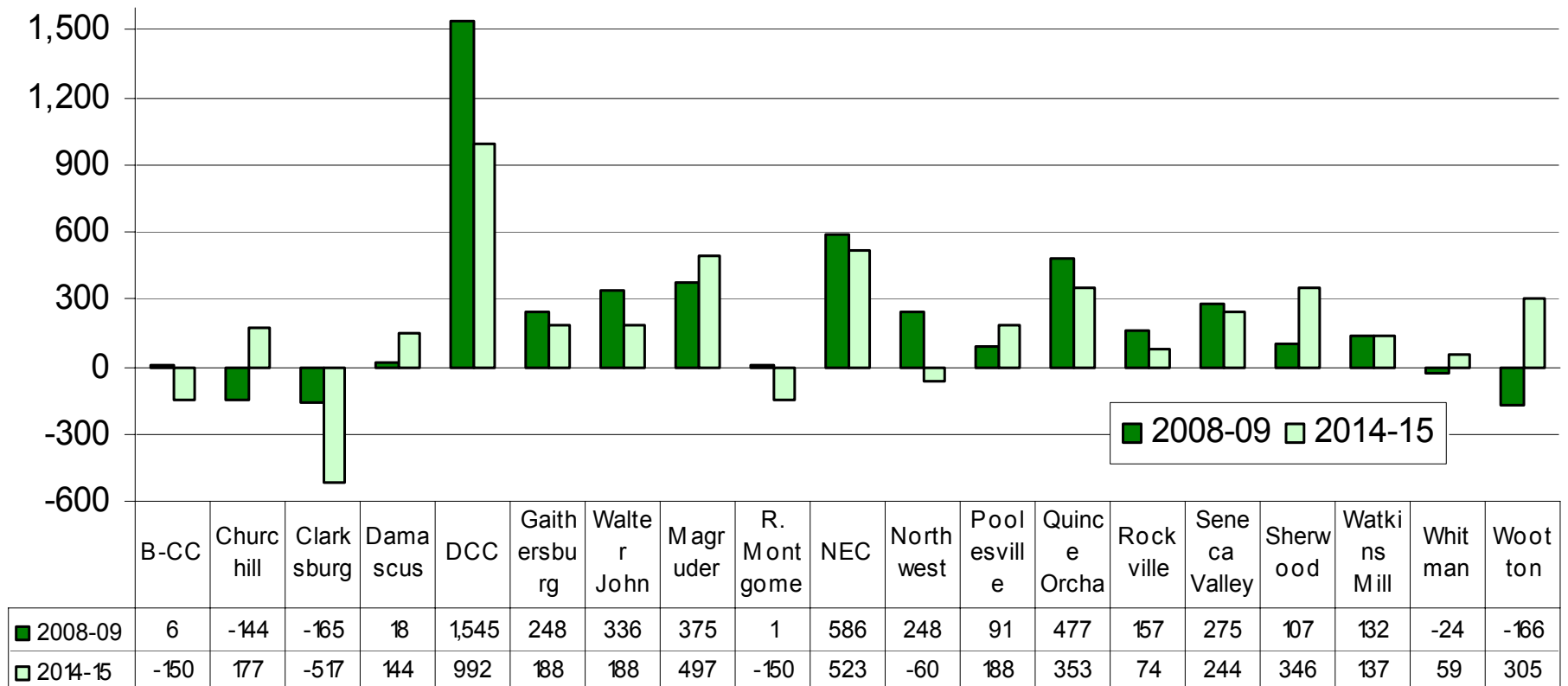

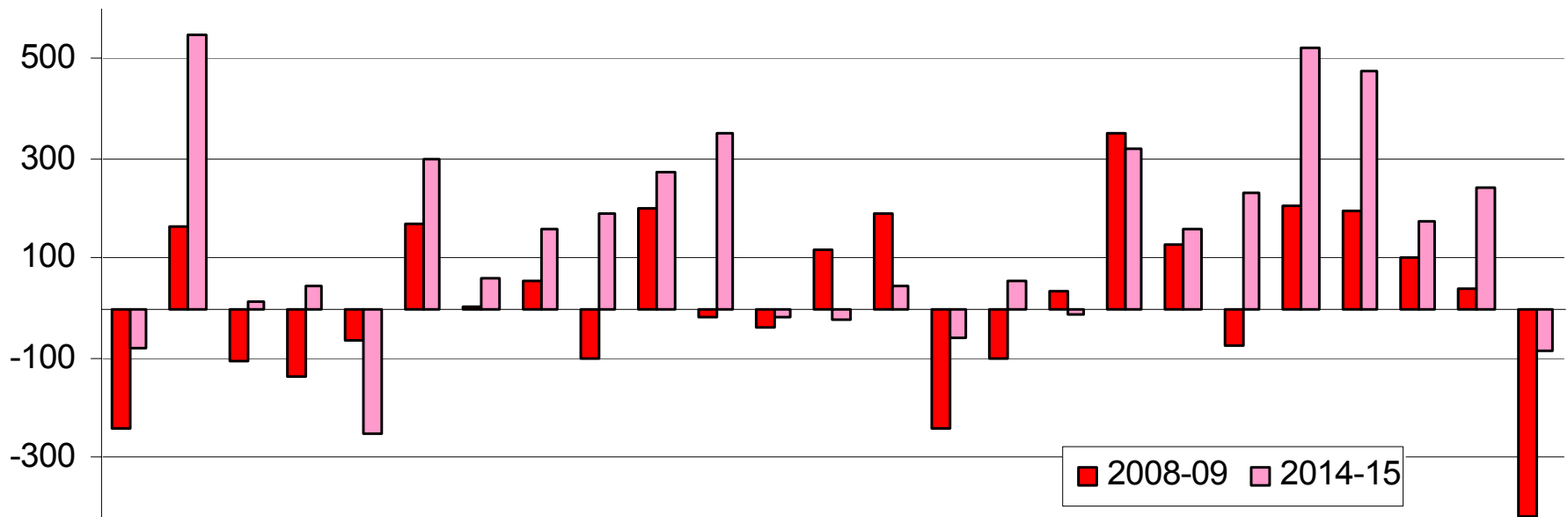
## Middle School Space Available/ Deficit, 2008-09 and 2014-15

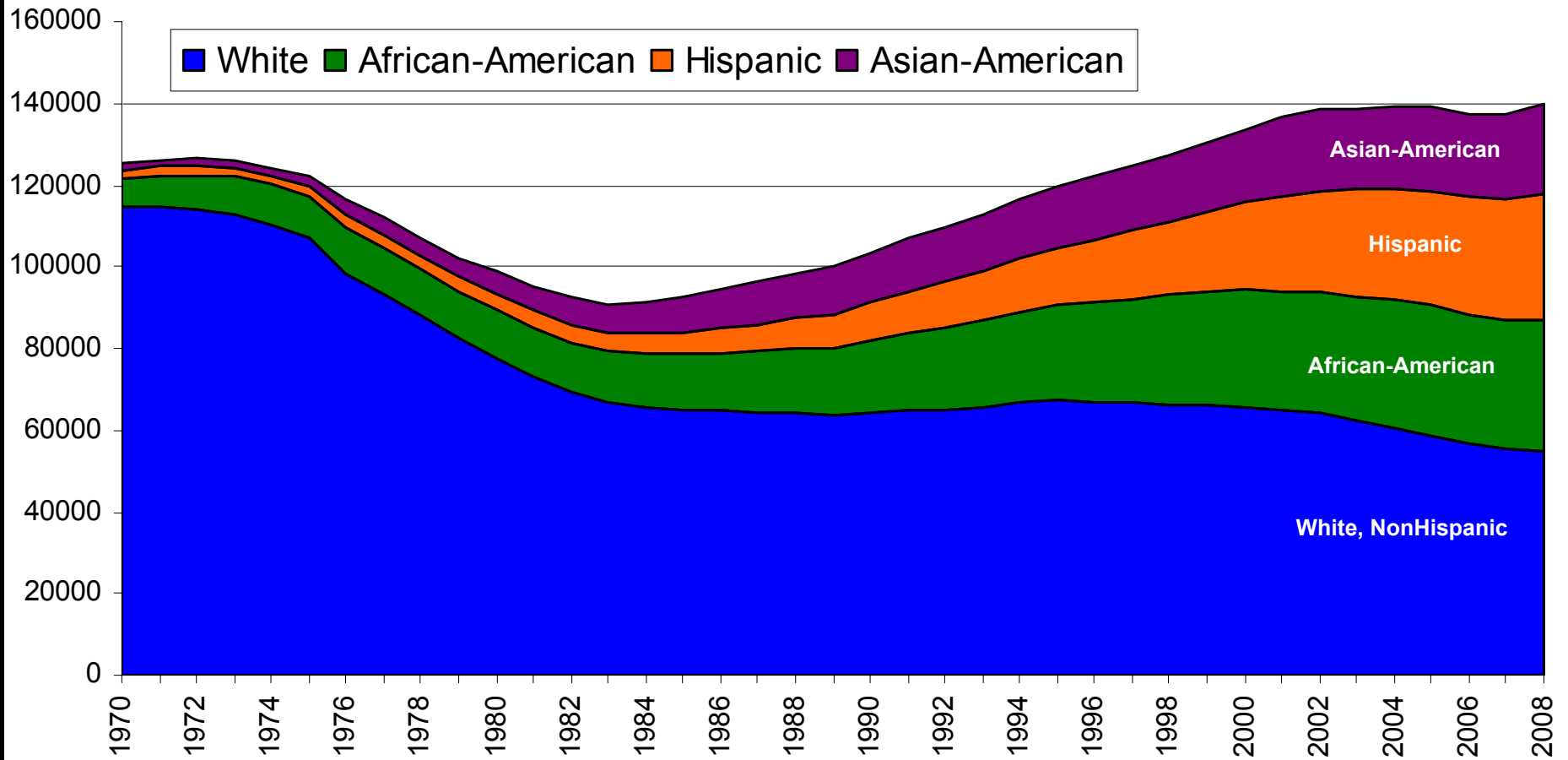

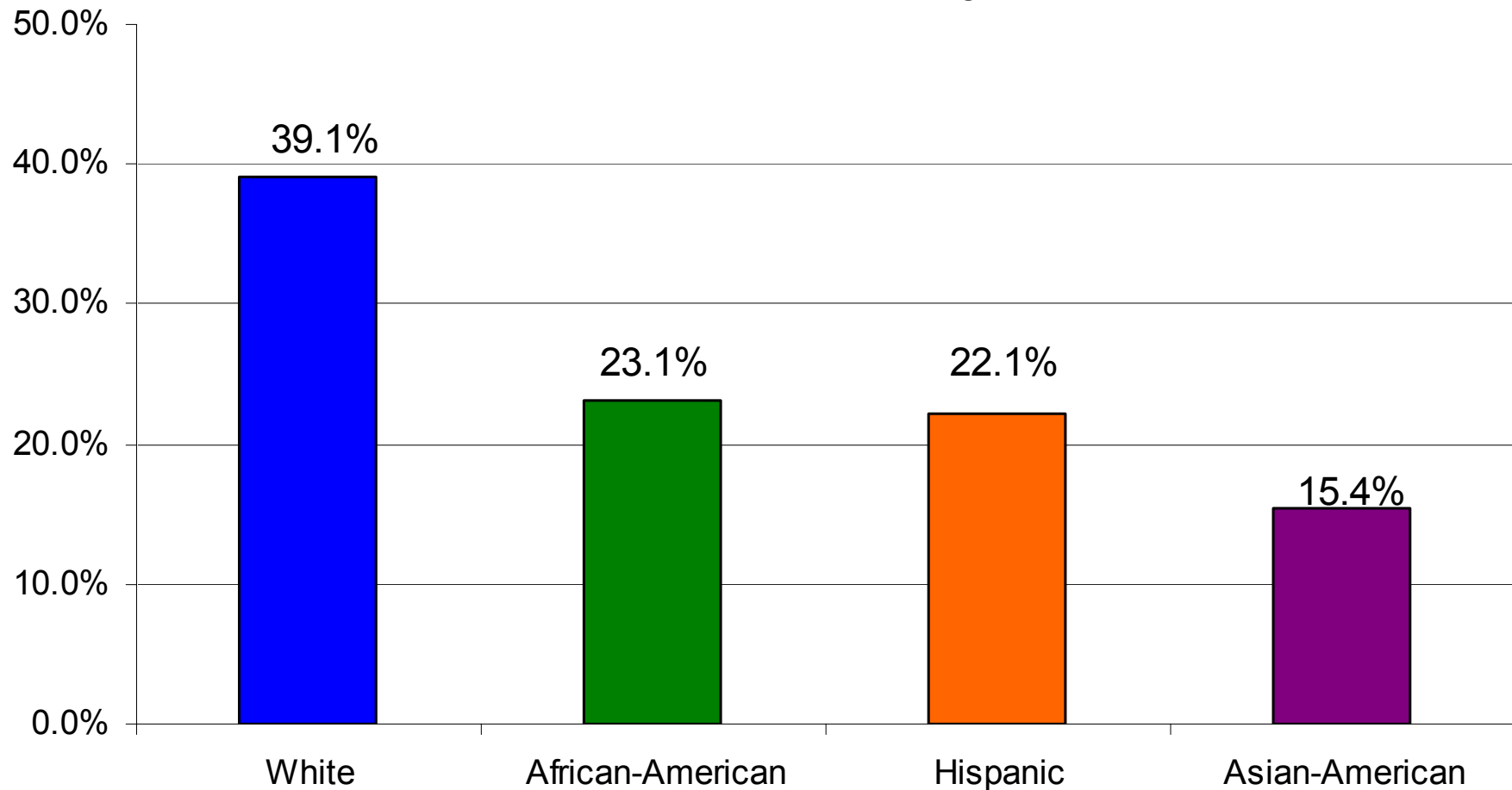
# Race/ Ethnic Trends

1970 to 2008 preliminary**

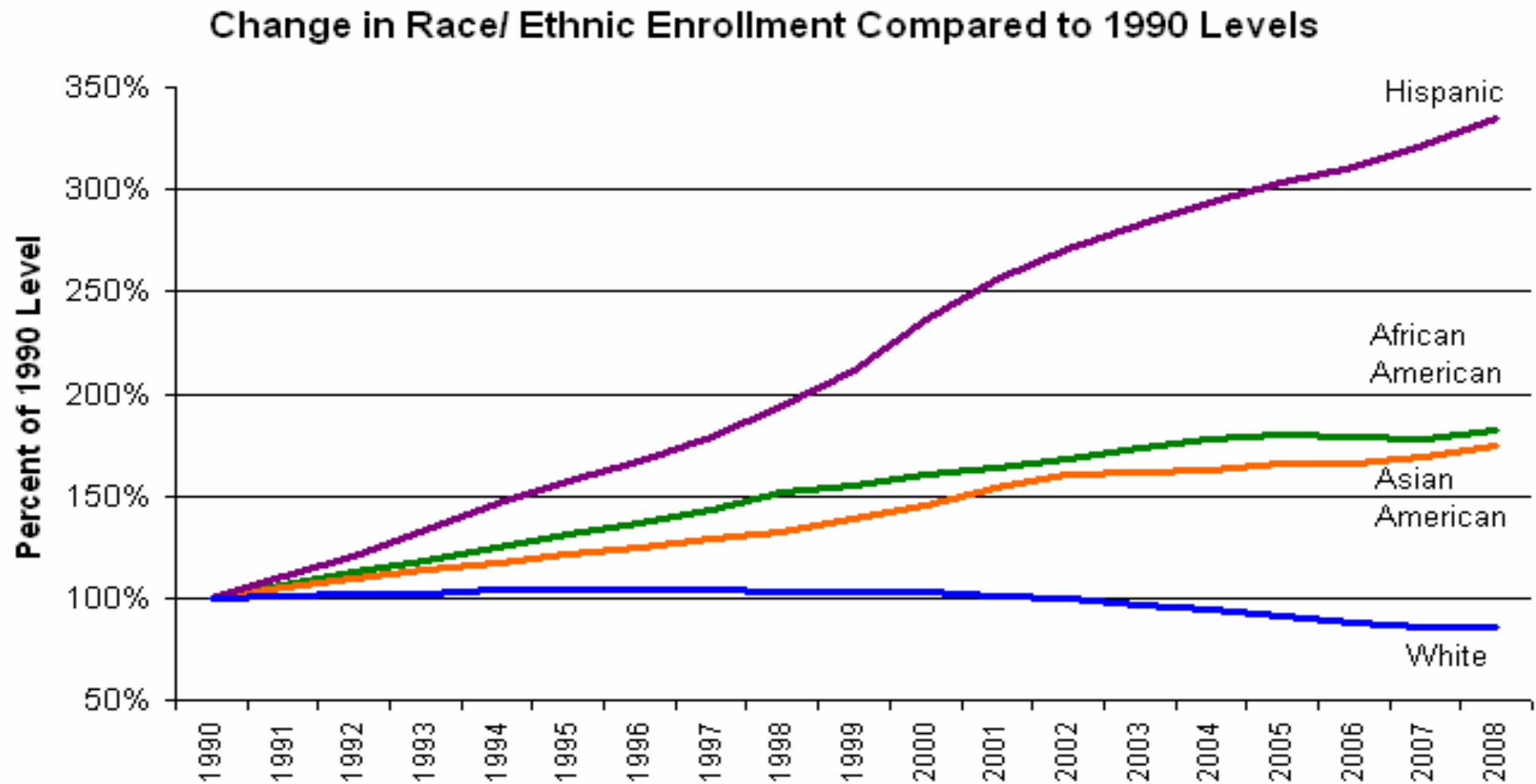

2008–09 preliminary**

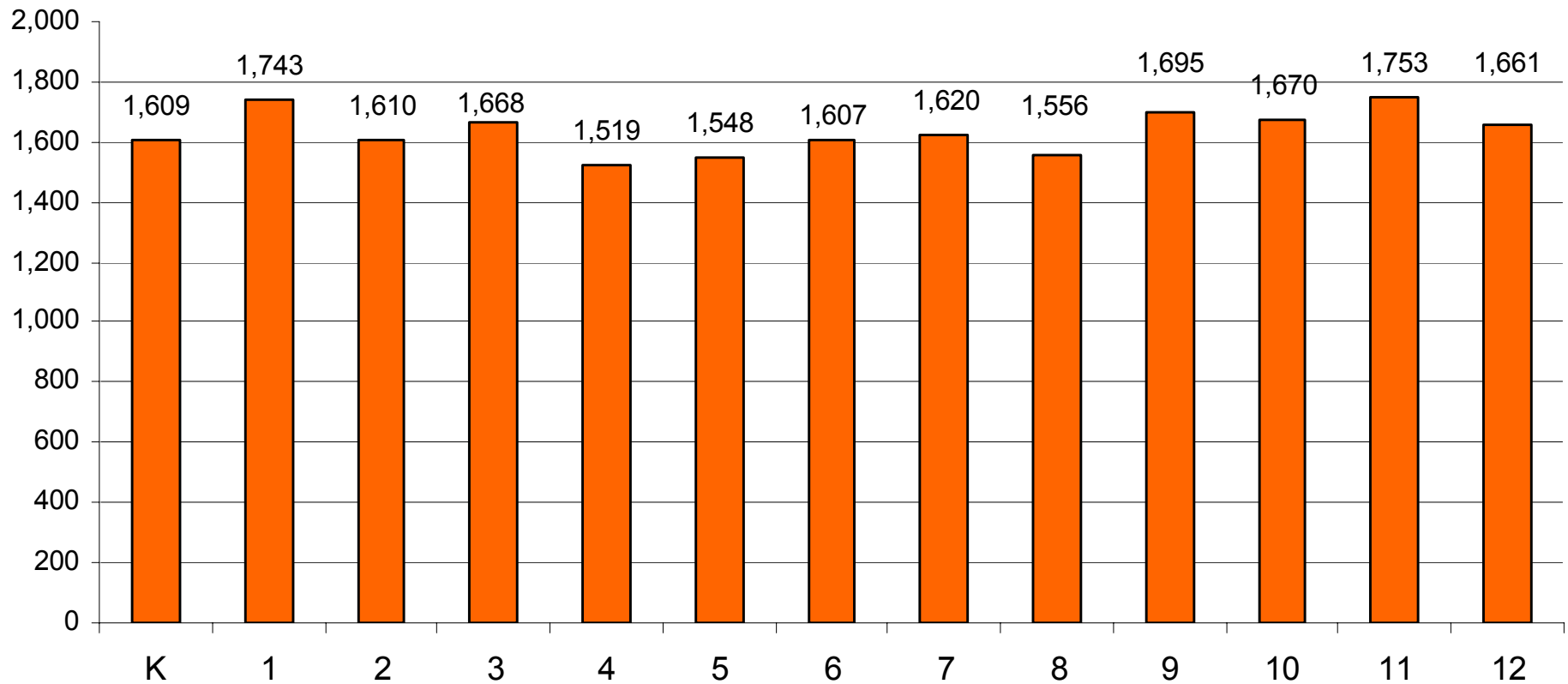

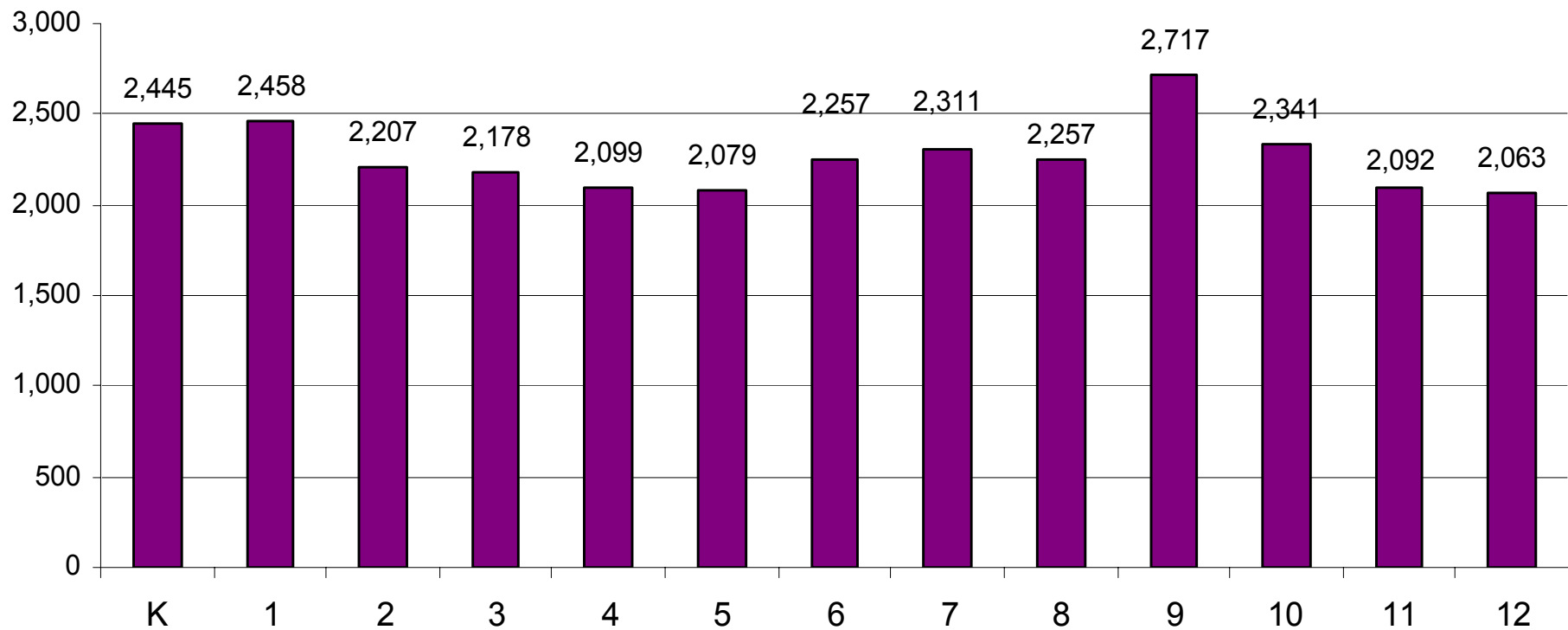
## MCPS Asian American Enrollment by Grade 2008–09





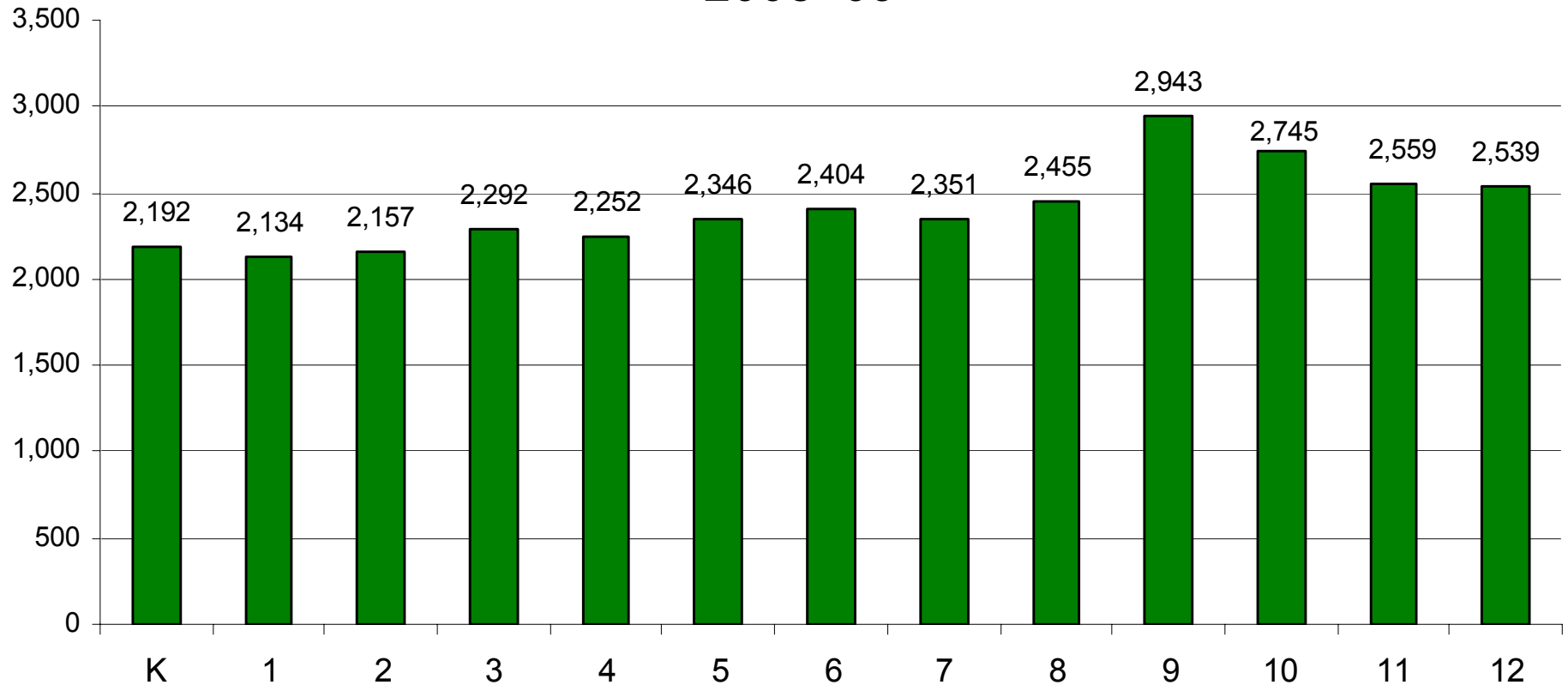

## MCPS Hispanic Enrollment by Grade 2008-09



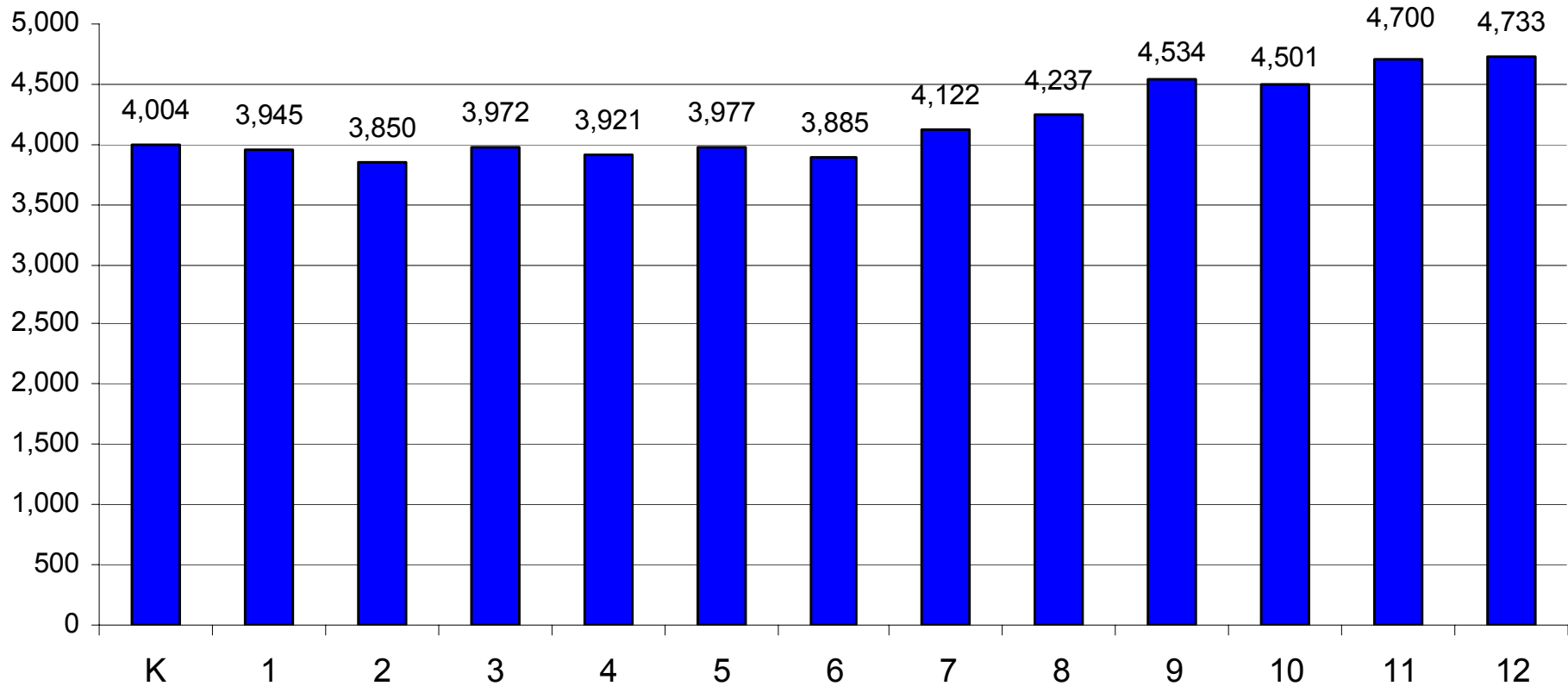

## MCPS African American Enrollment by Grade 2008–09



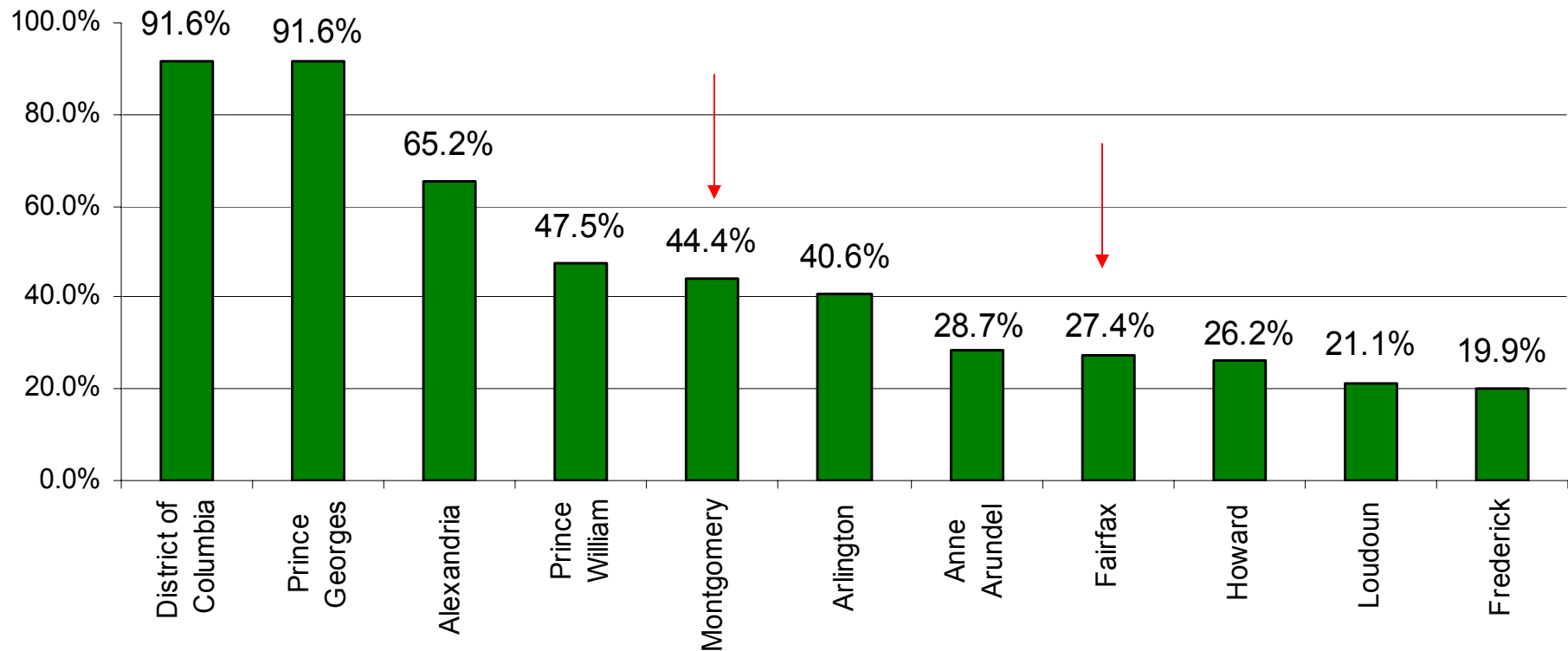

## MCPS White Enrollment by Grade 2008–09



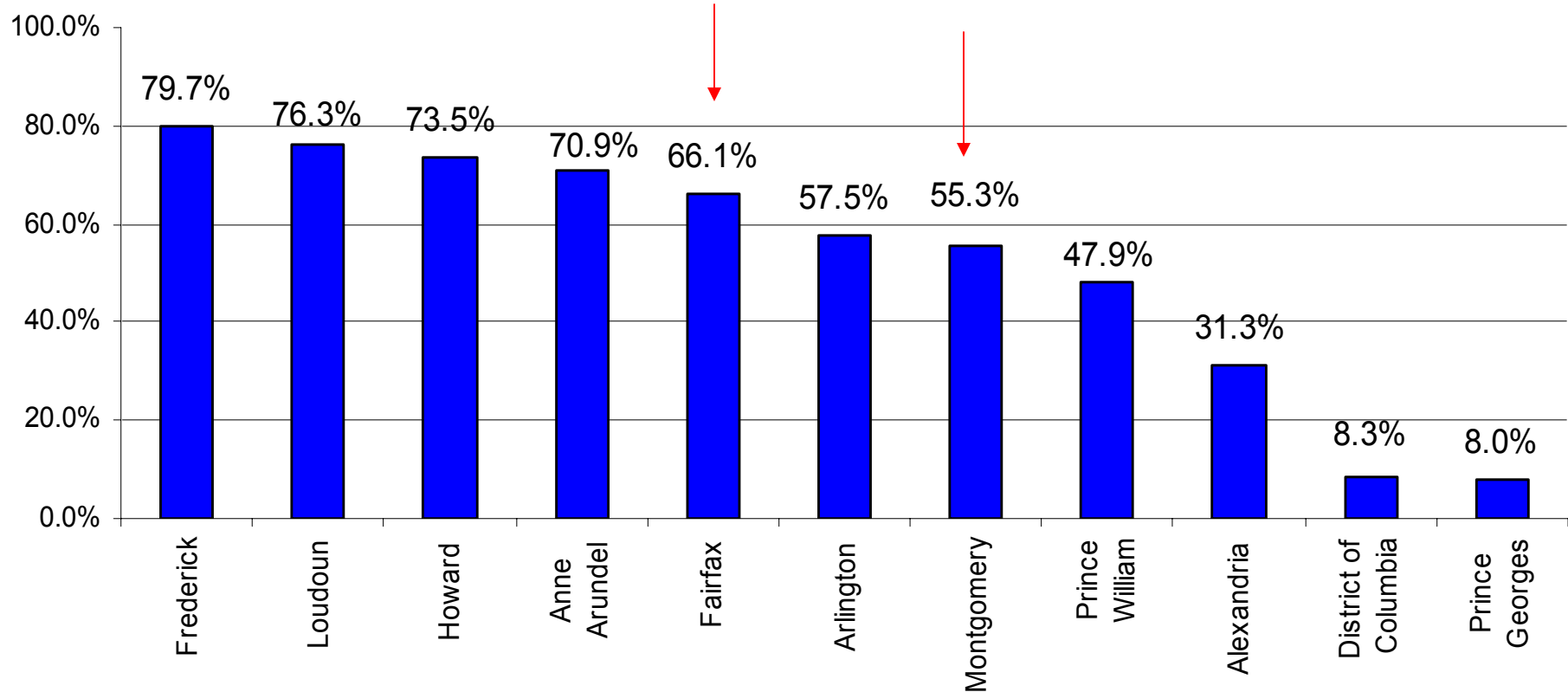

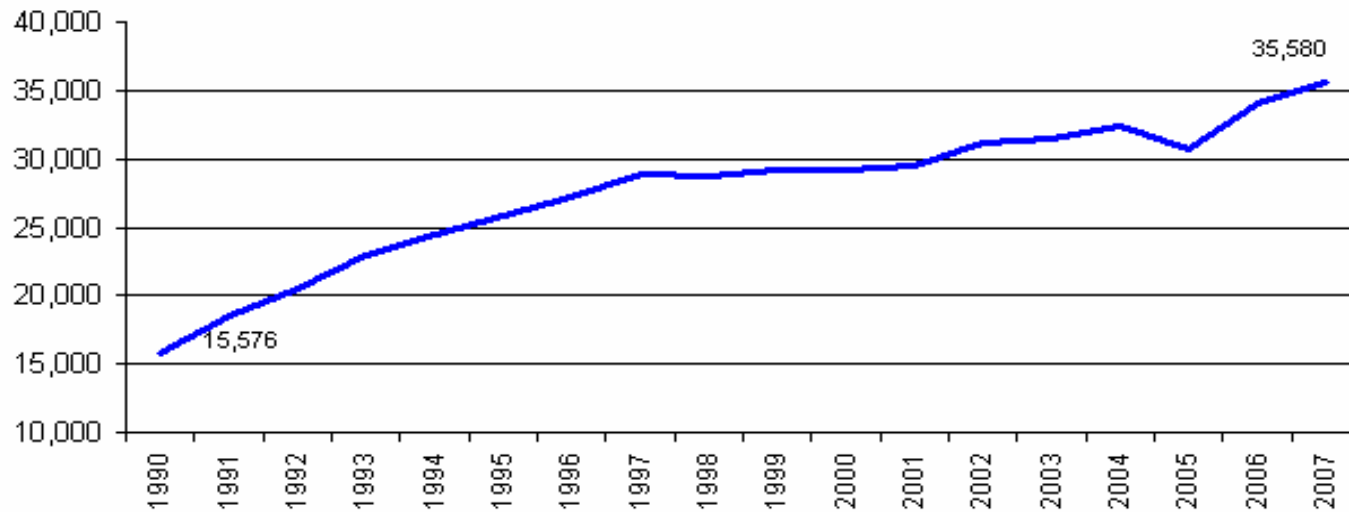
**Percent White, Non-Hispanic and Asian-American Enrollment in Washington Metro Area School Districts, 2007-08**



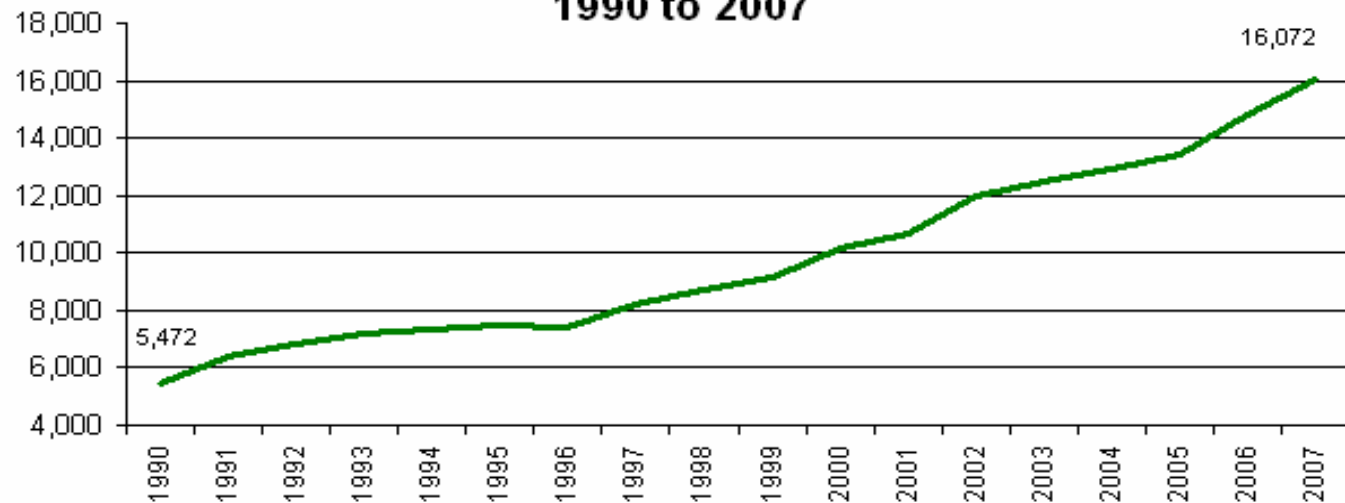

1990 to 2007**

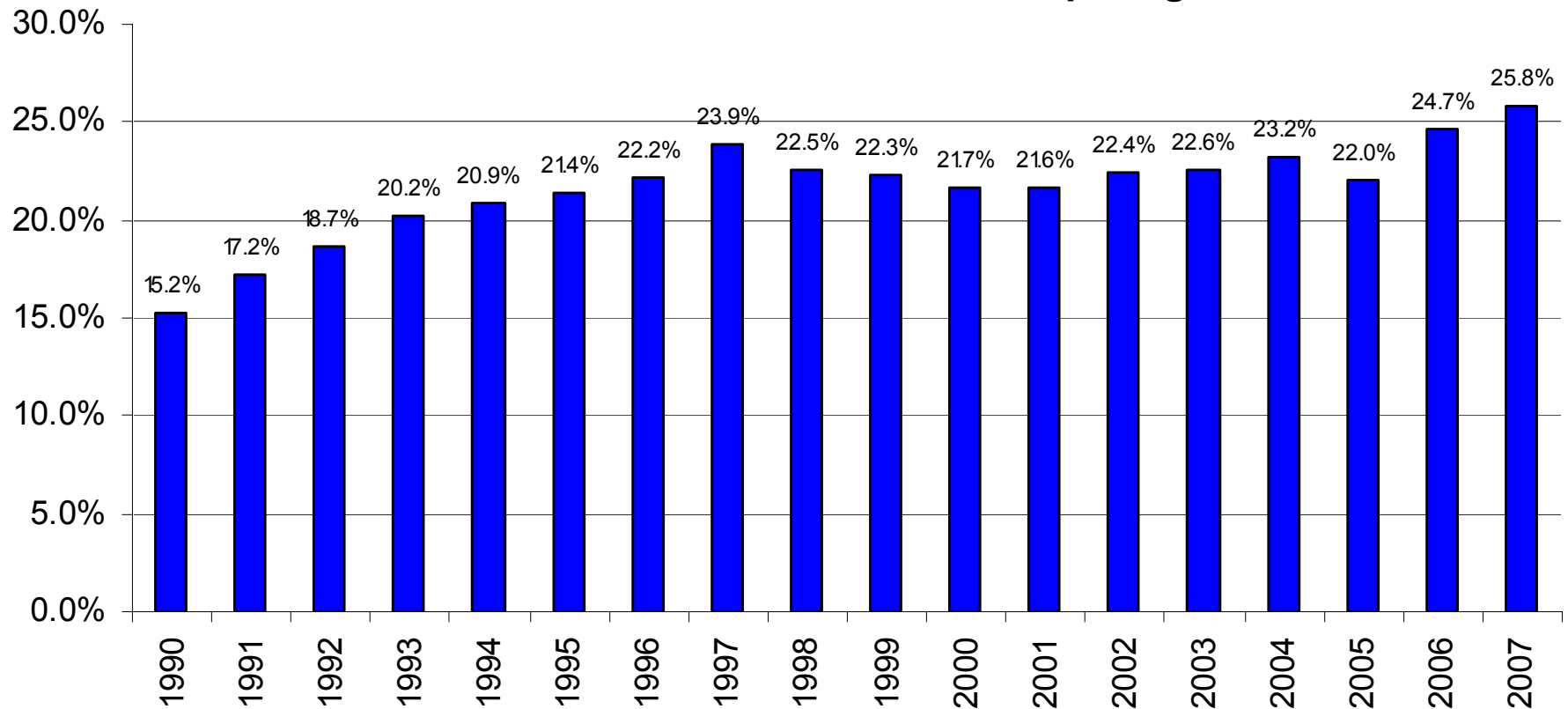

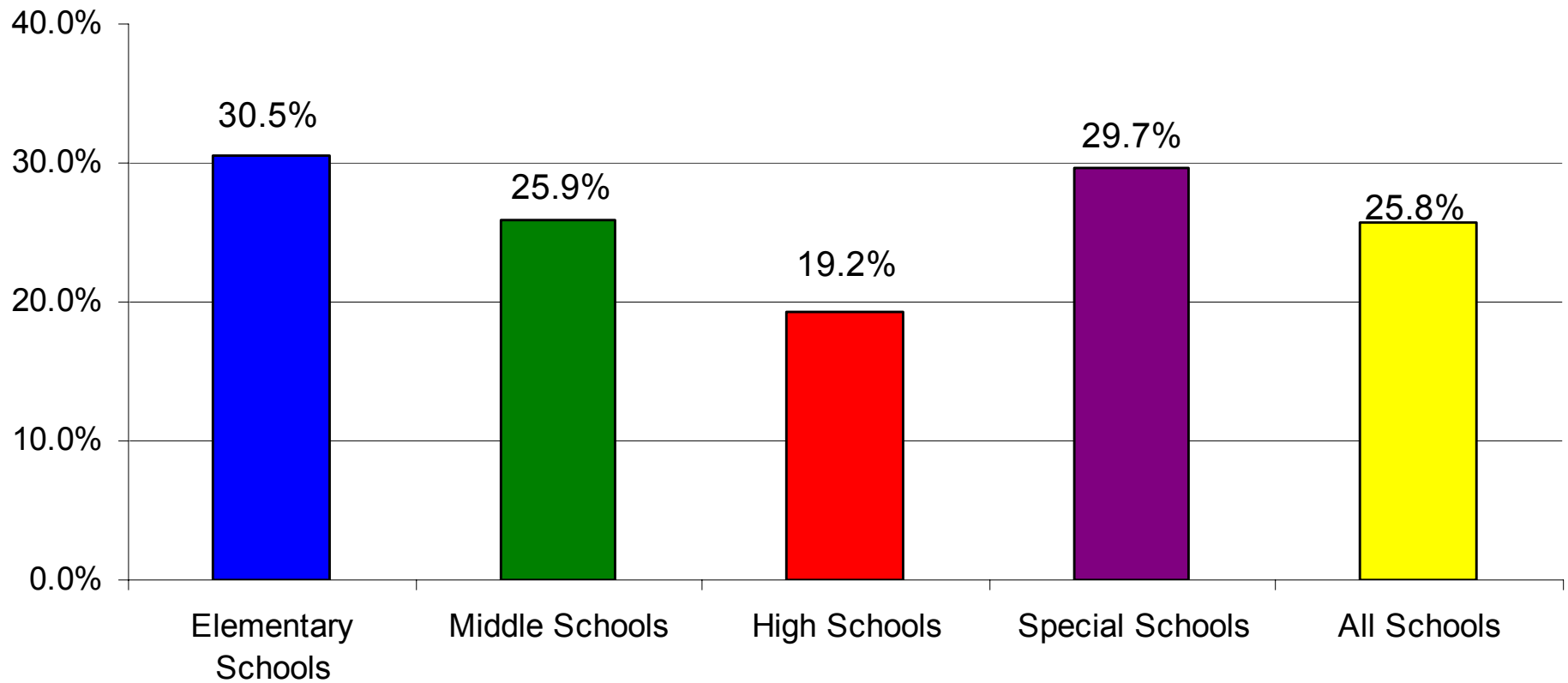
**MCPS Free and Reduced-Price Meals System (FARMS)  
Percent of Total Enrollment Participating**





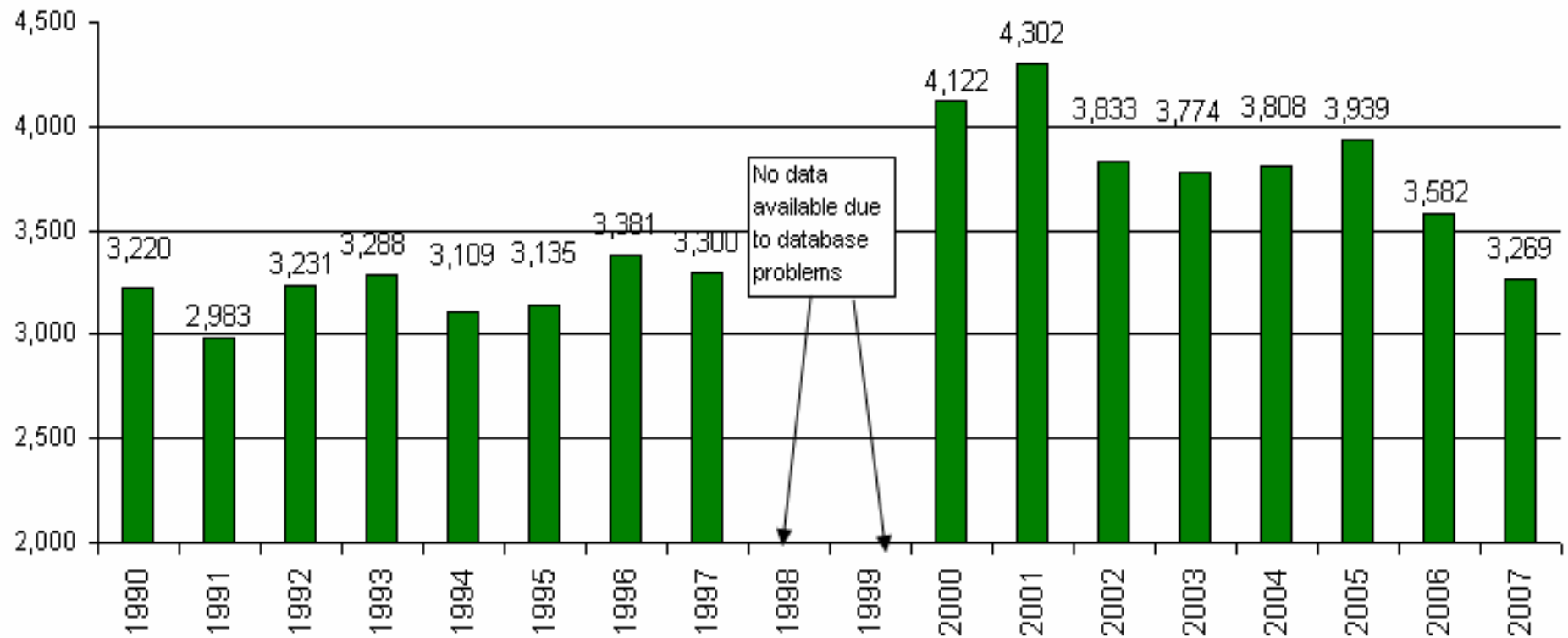

Percent Participation by School Level, 2007-08**



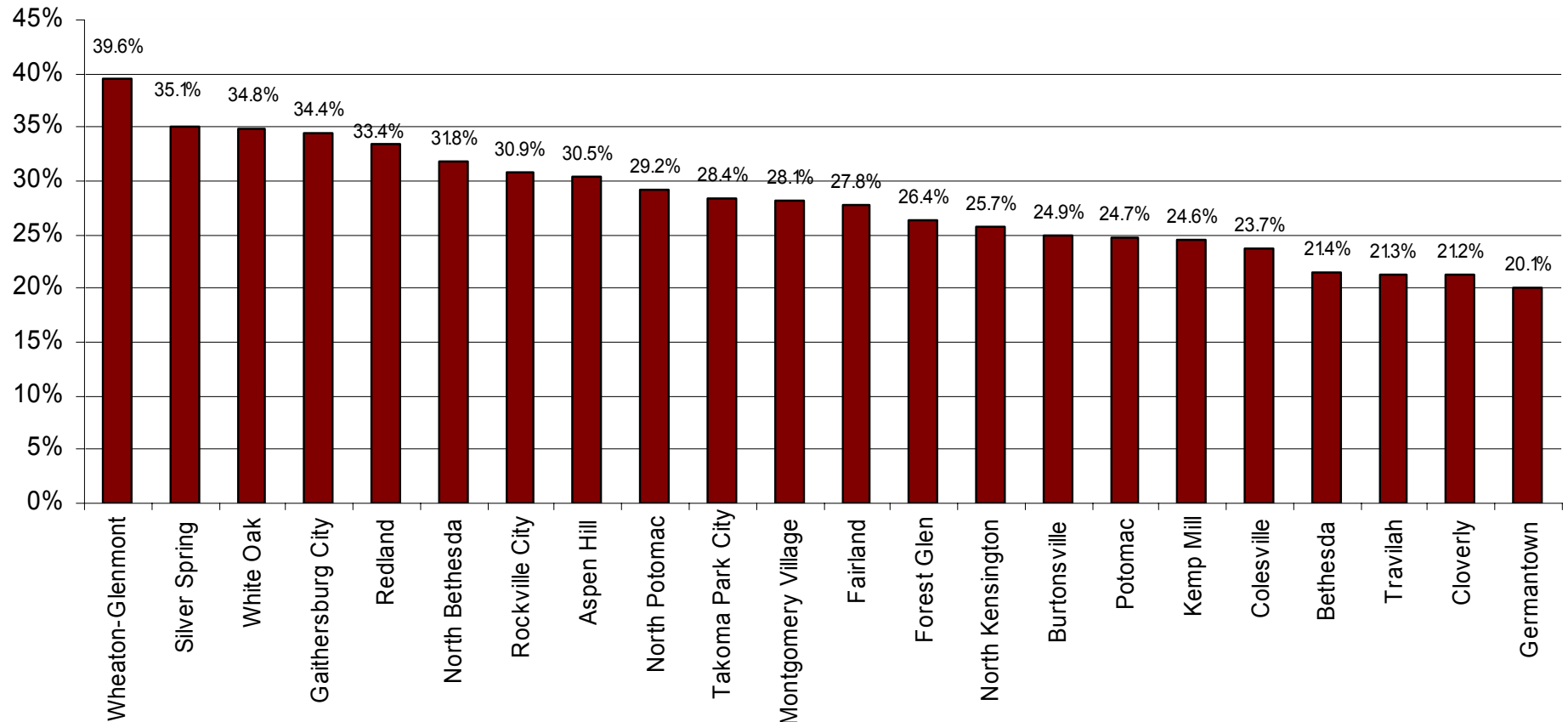

## Enrollment of Students from Outside the U.S.A.



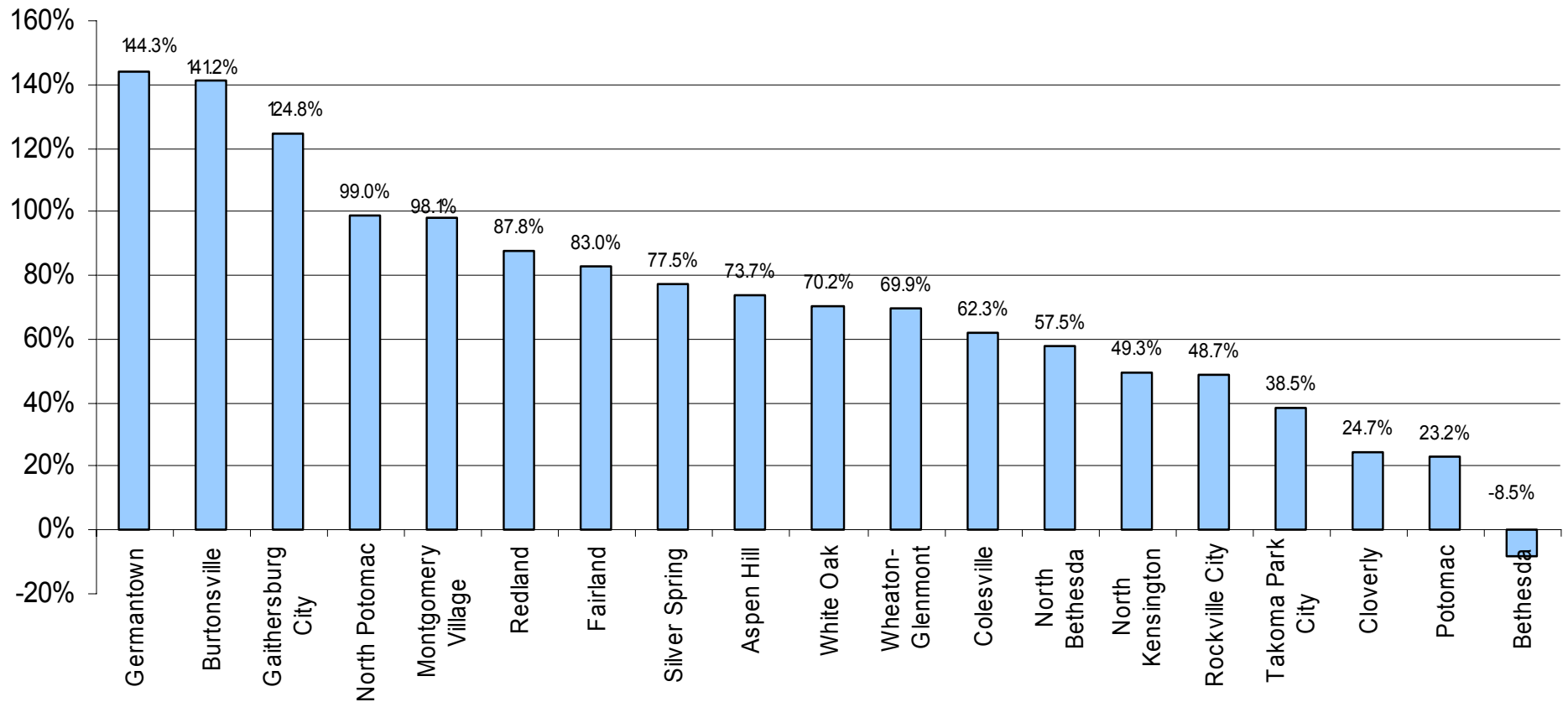

## Percent of Population Foreign-Born in 2000



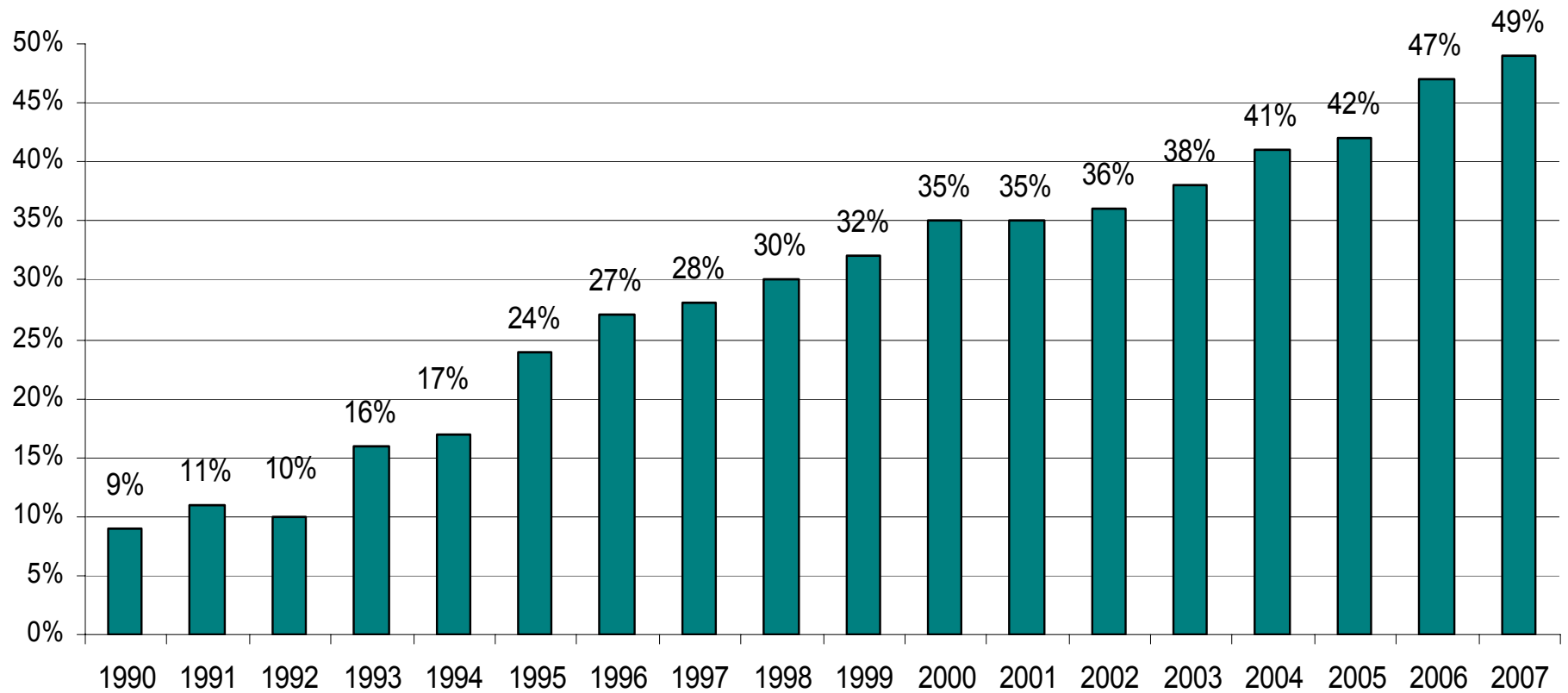

## Percent Change in Foreign-Born Population, 1990 to 2000

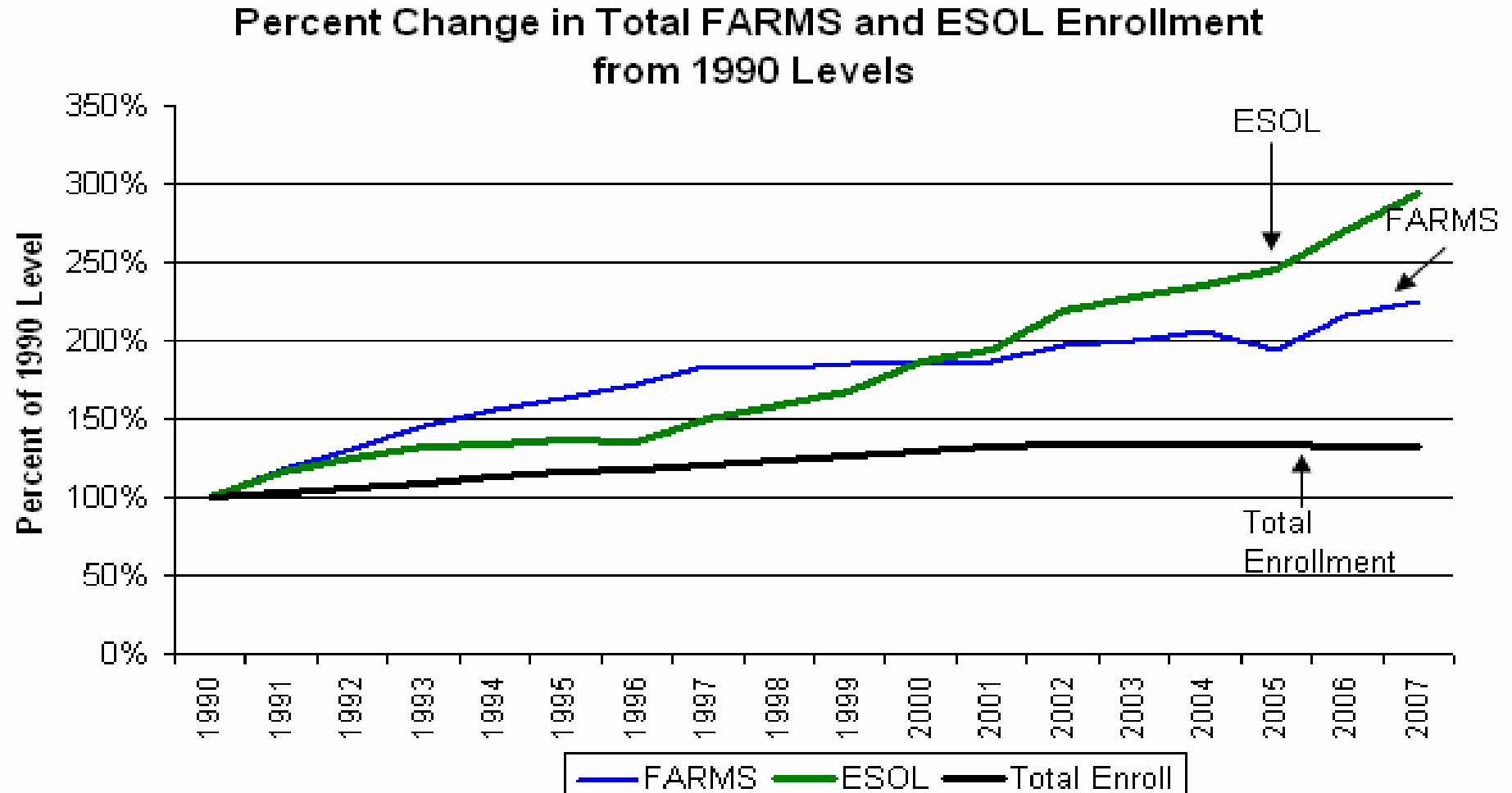

## Percent of MCPS ESOL Students Born in United States



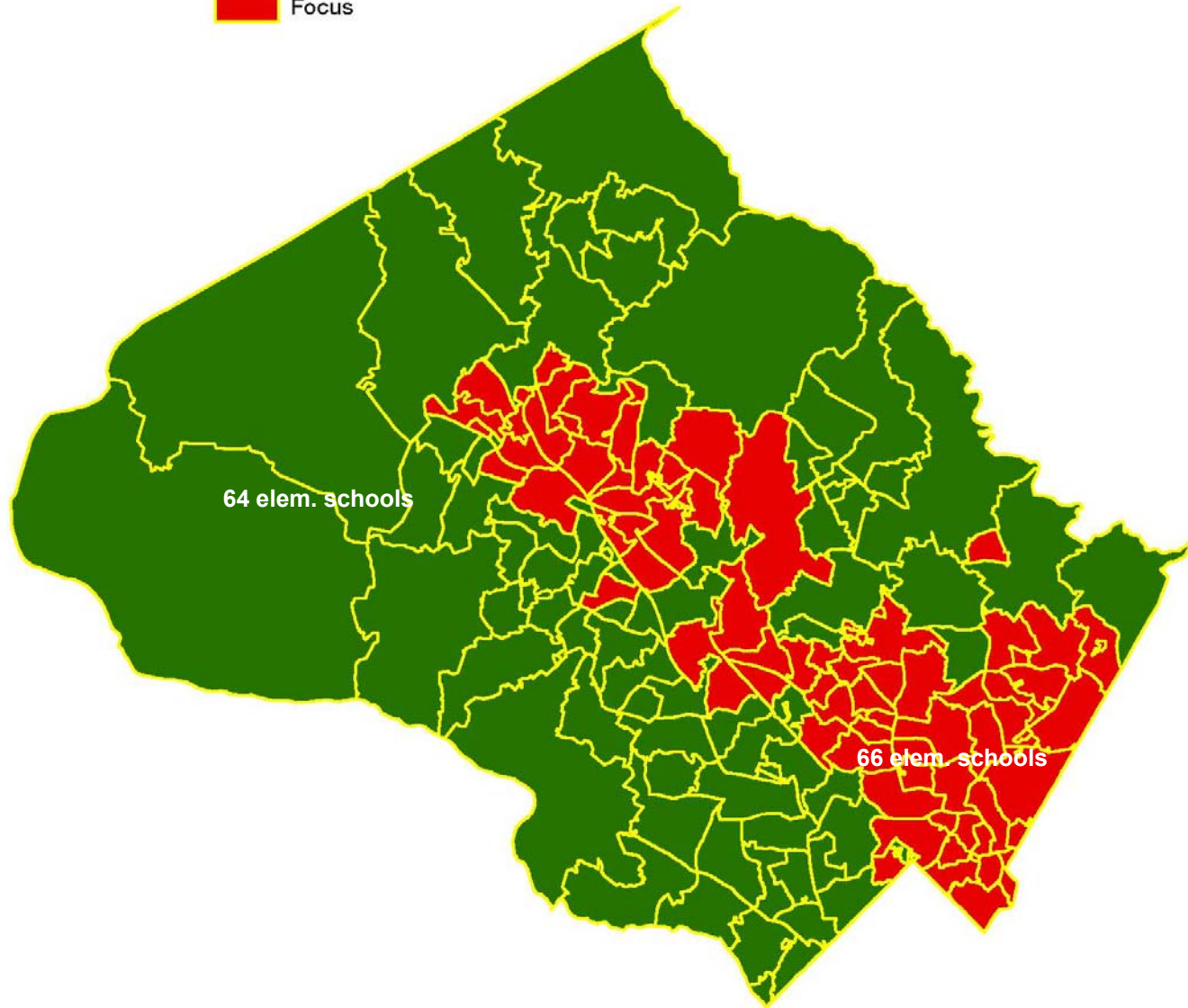

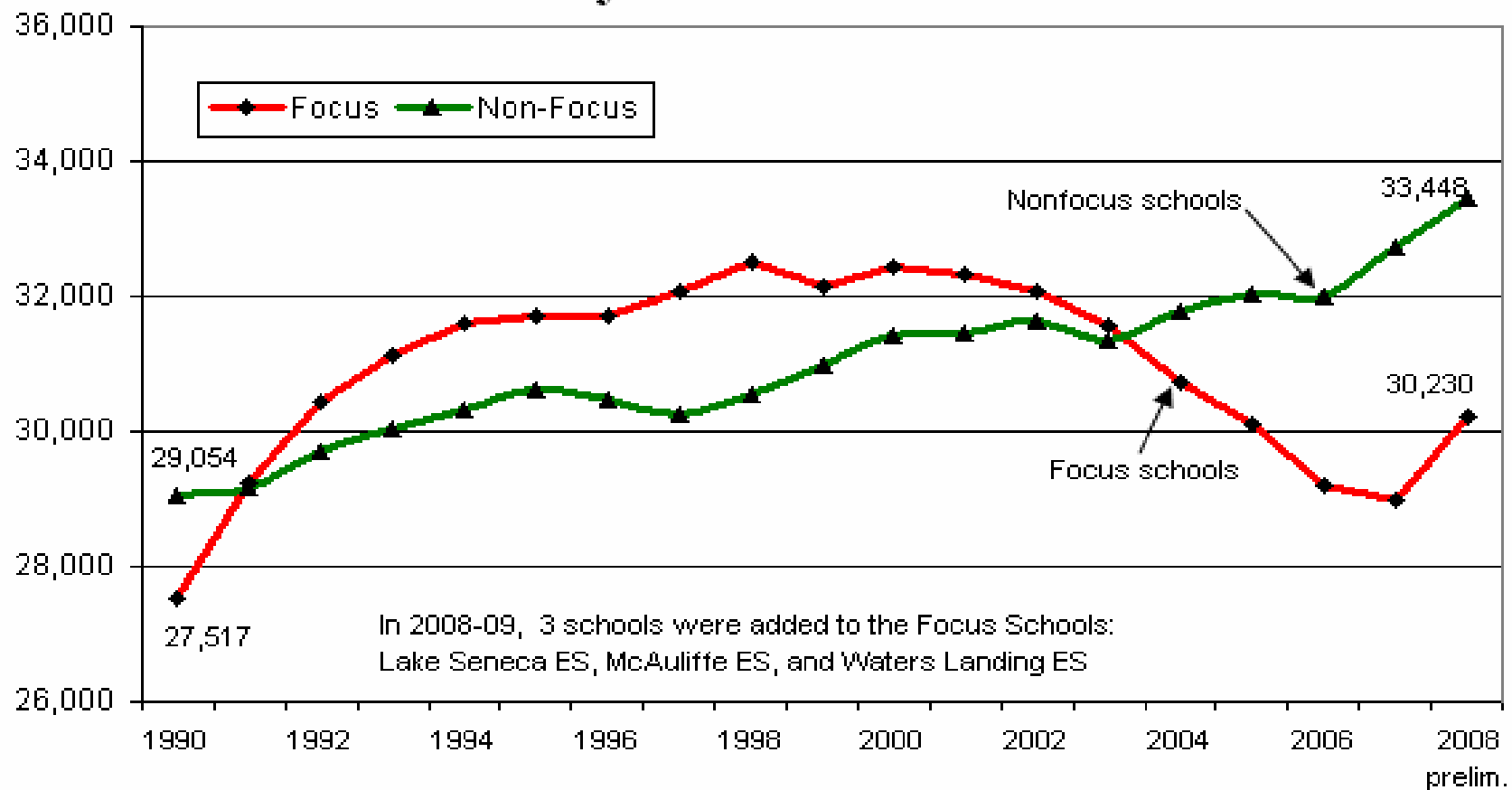

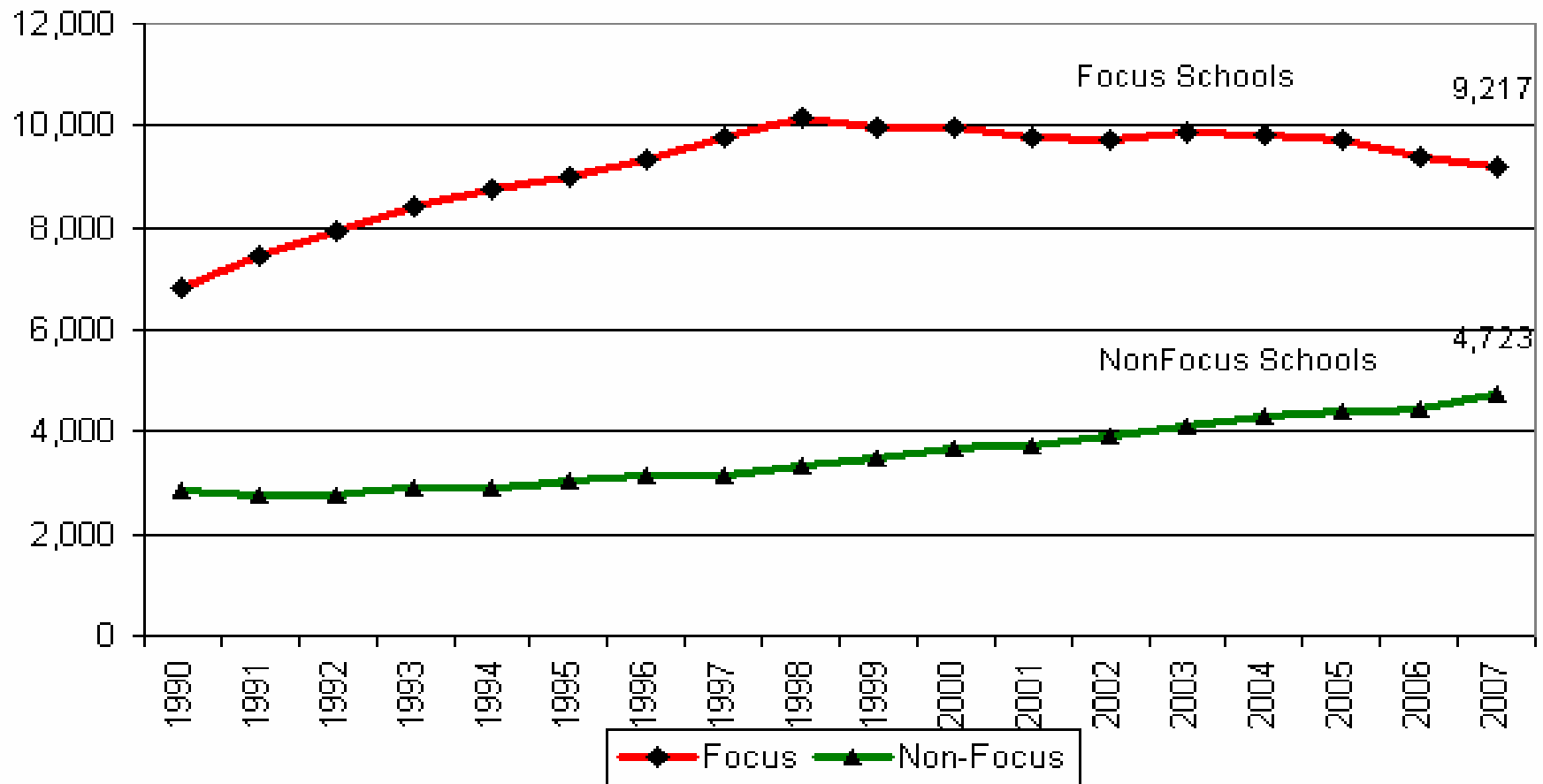

## Total Enrollment in Focus and Non-Focus Elementary Schools: 1990 to 2008



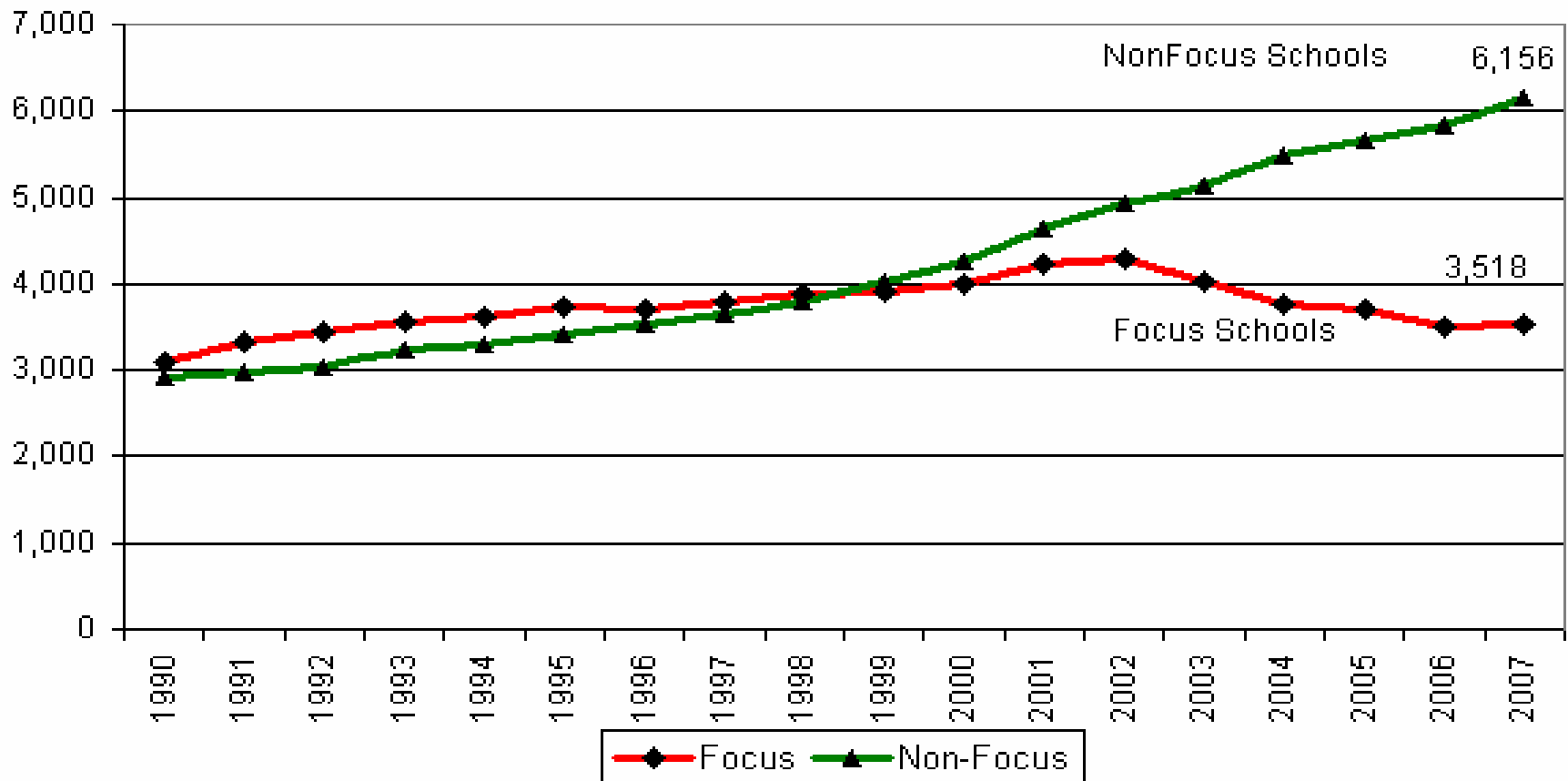

**African-American Enrollment in Focus and Non-Focus Elementary Schools: 1990 to 2007**



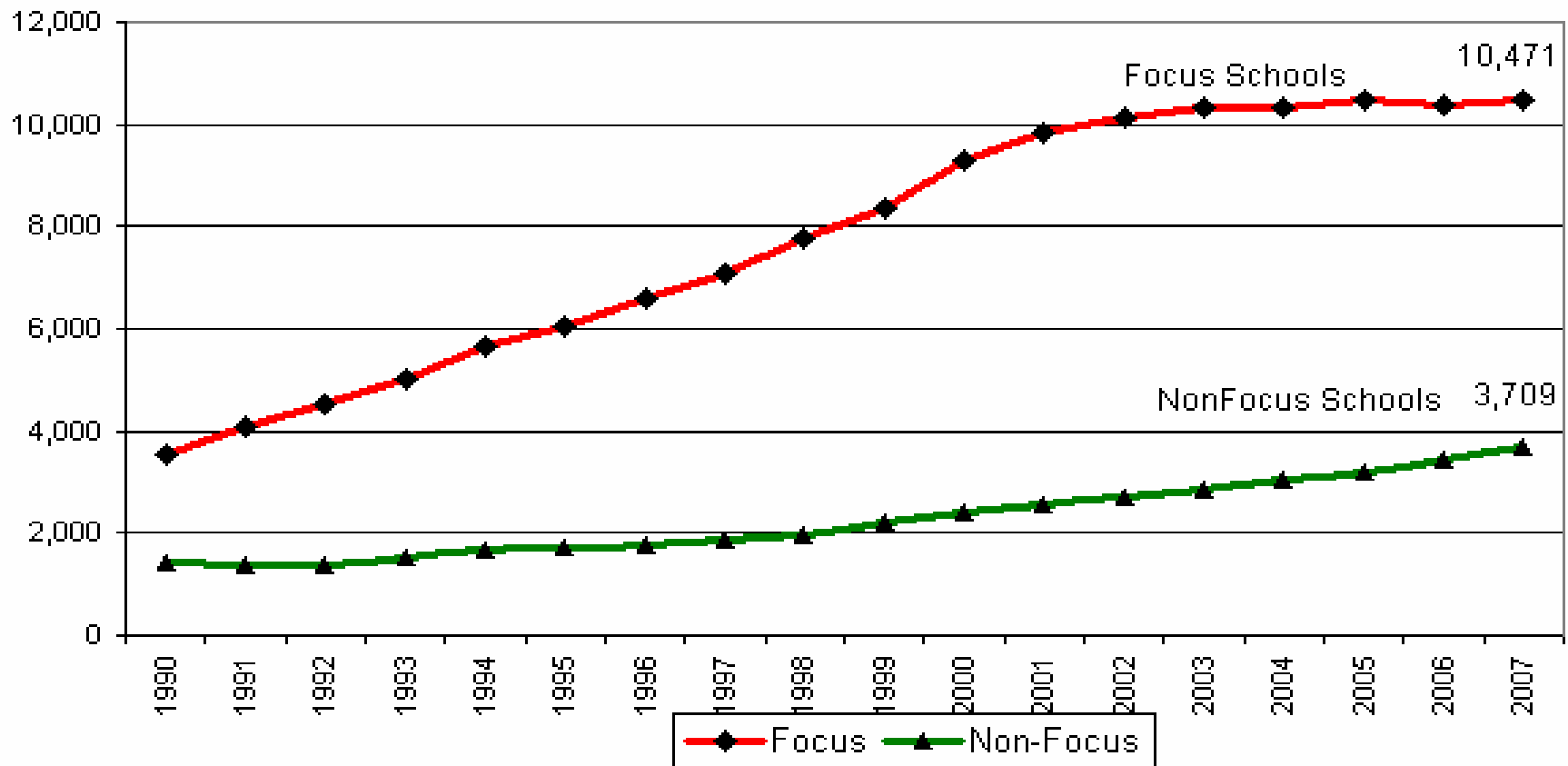

**Asian-American Enrollment in Focus and Non-Focus Elementary Schools: 1990 to 2007**



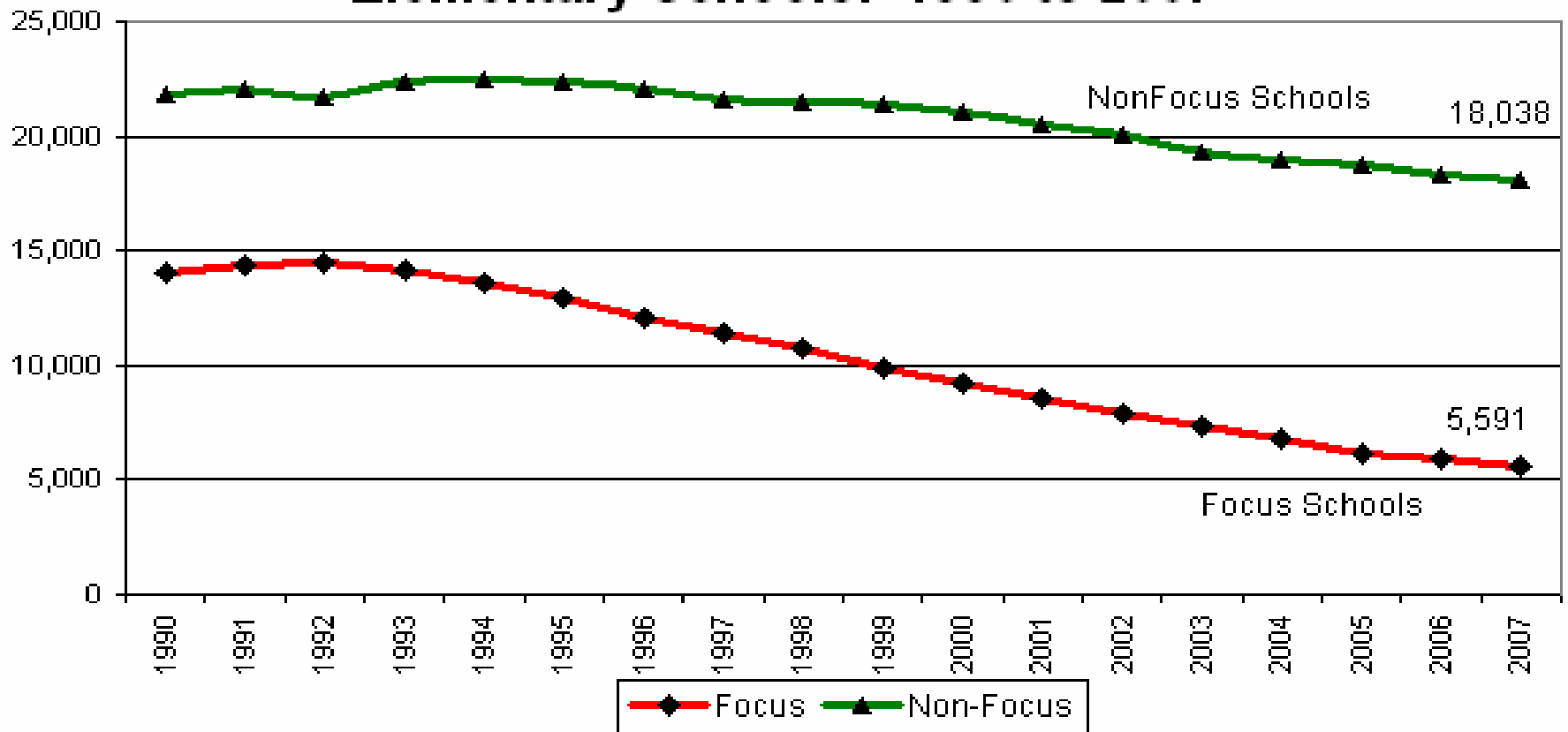

## Hispanic Enrollment in Focus and Non-Focus Elementary Schools: 1990 to 2007



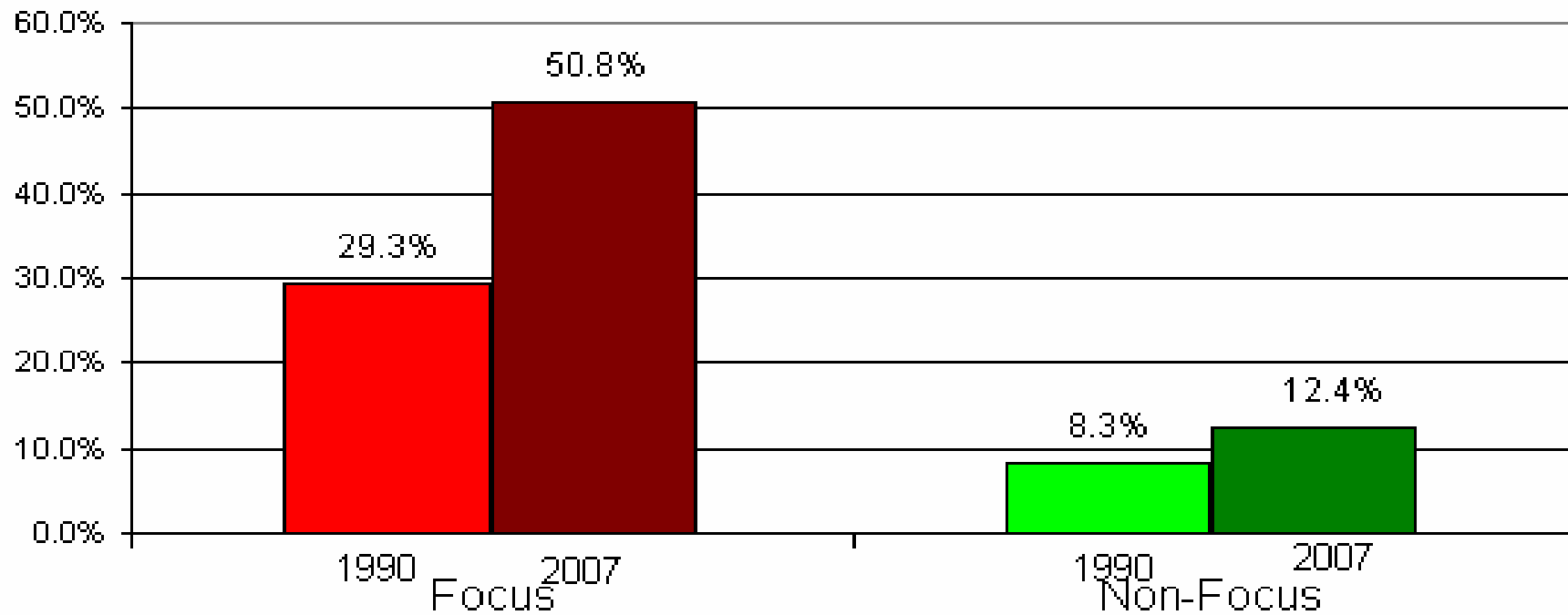

## White Enrollment in Focus and Non-Focus Elementary Schools: 1990 to 2007



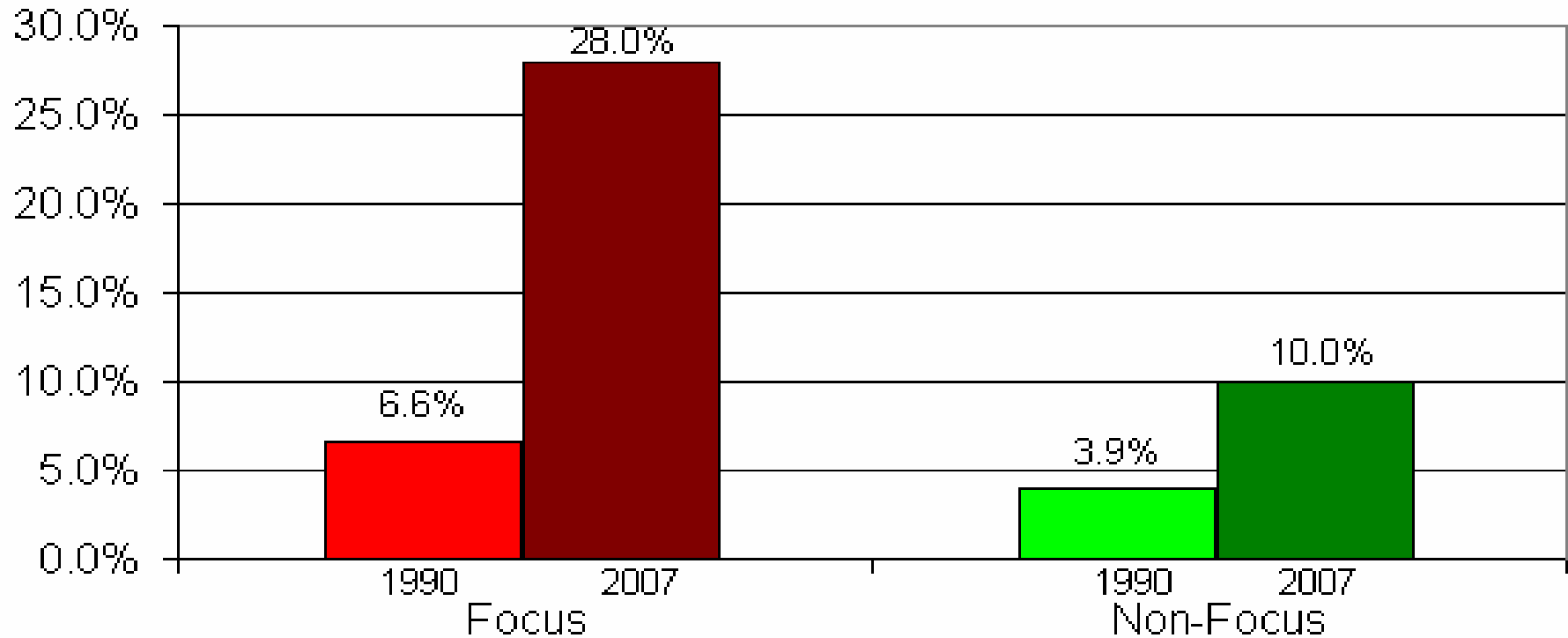

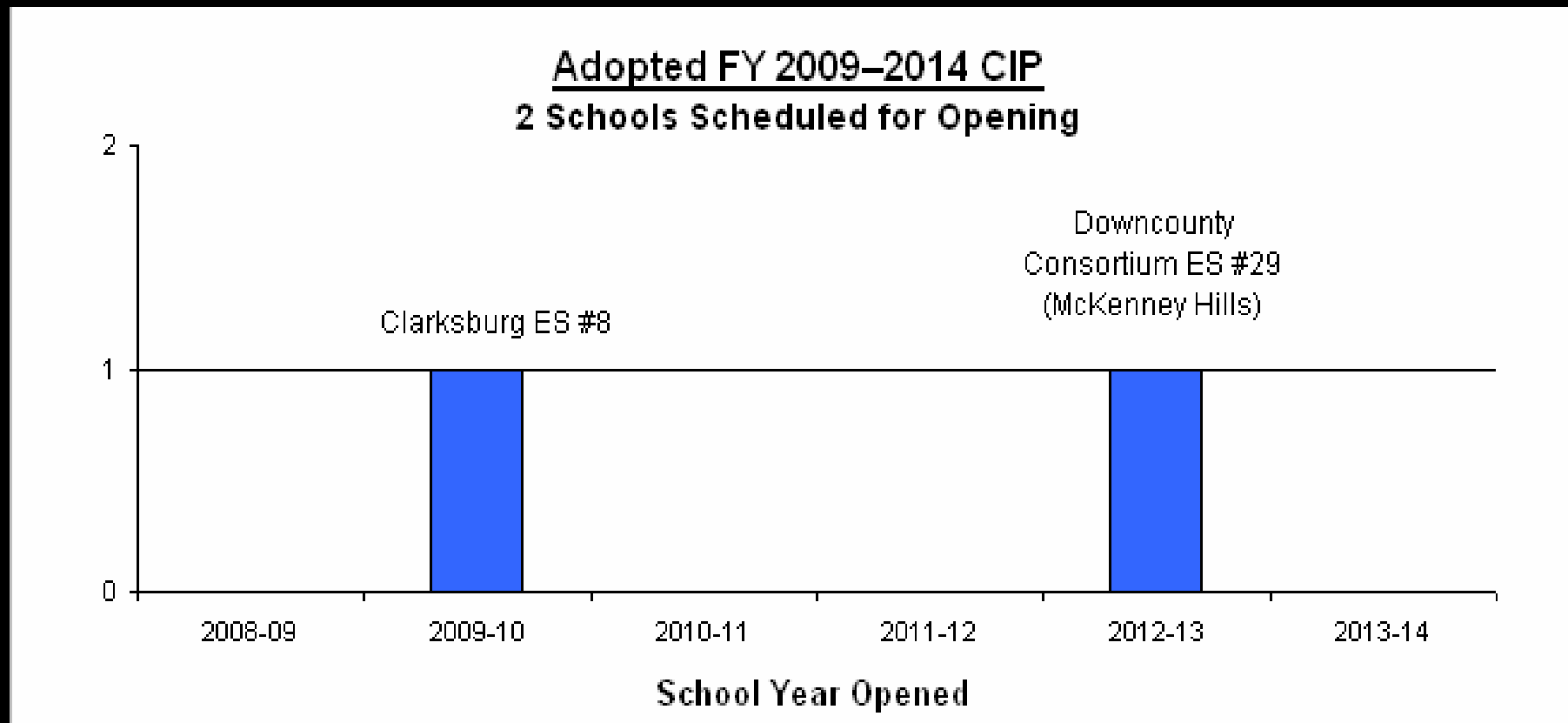
**Percent of Focus and Non-Focus Schools Enrollment

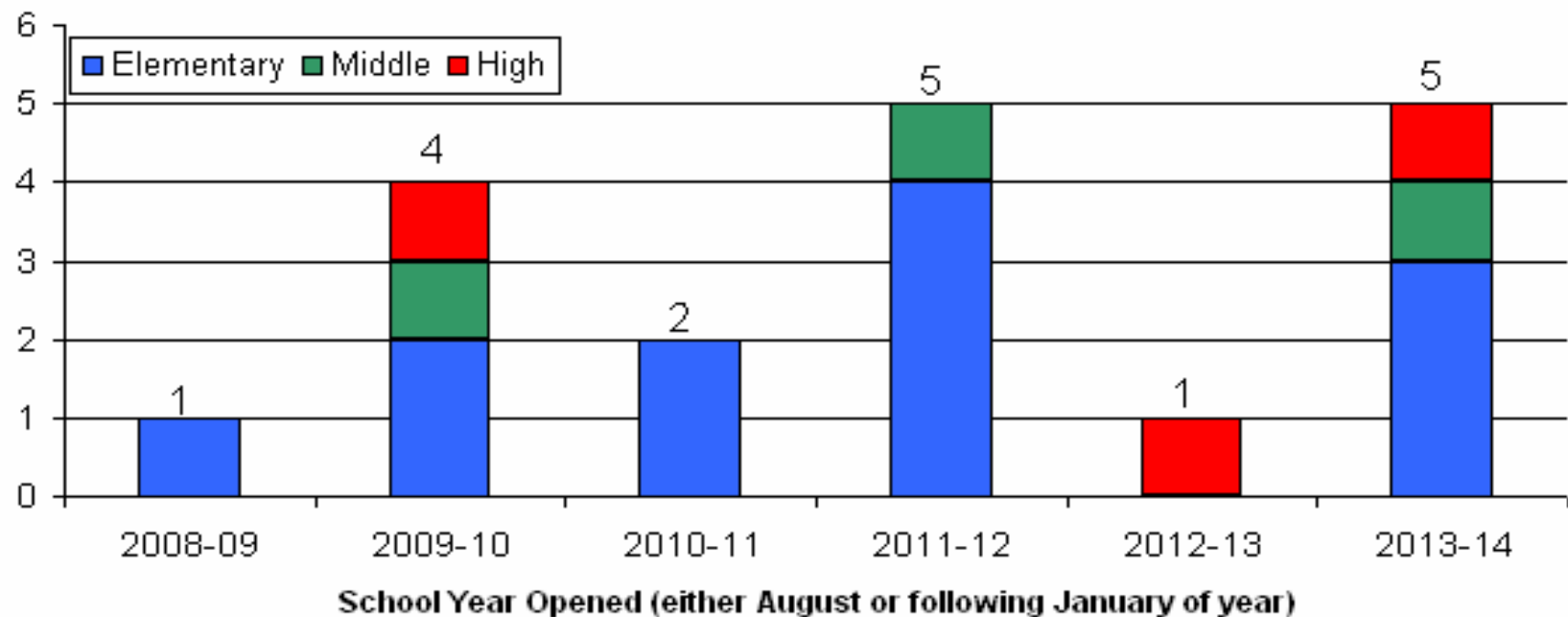

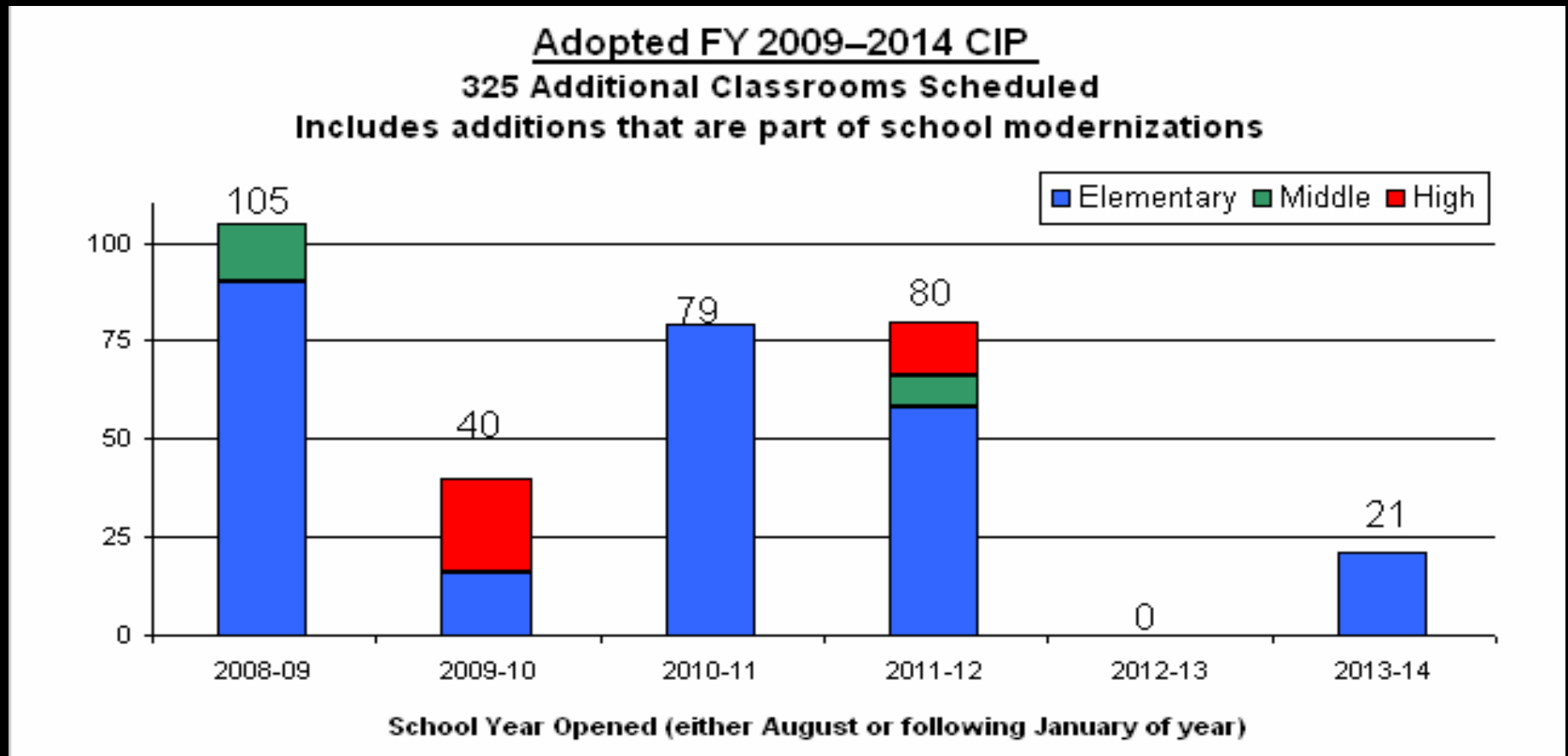

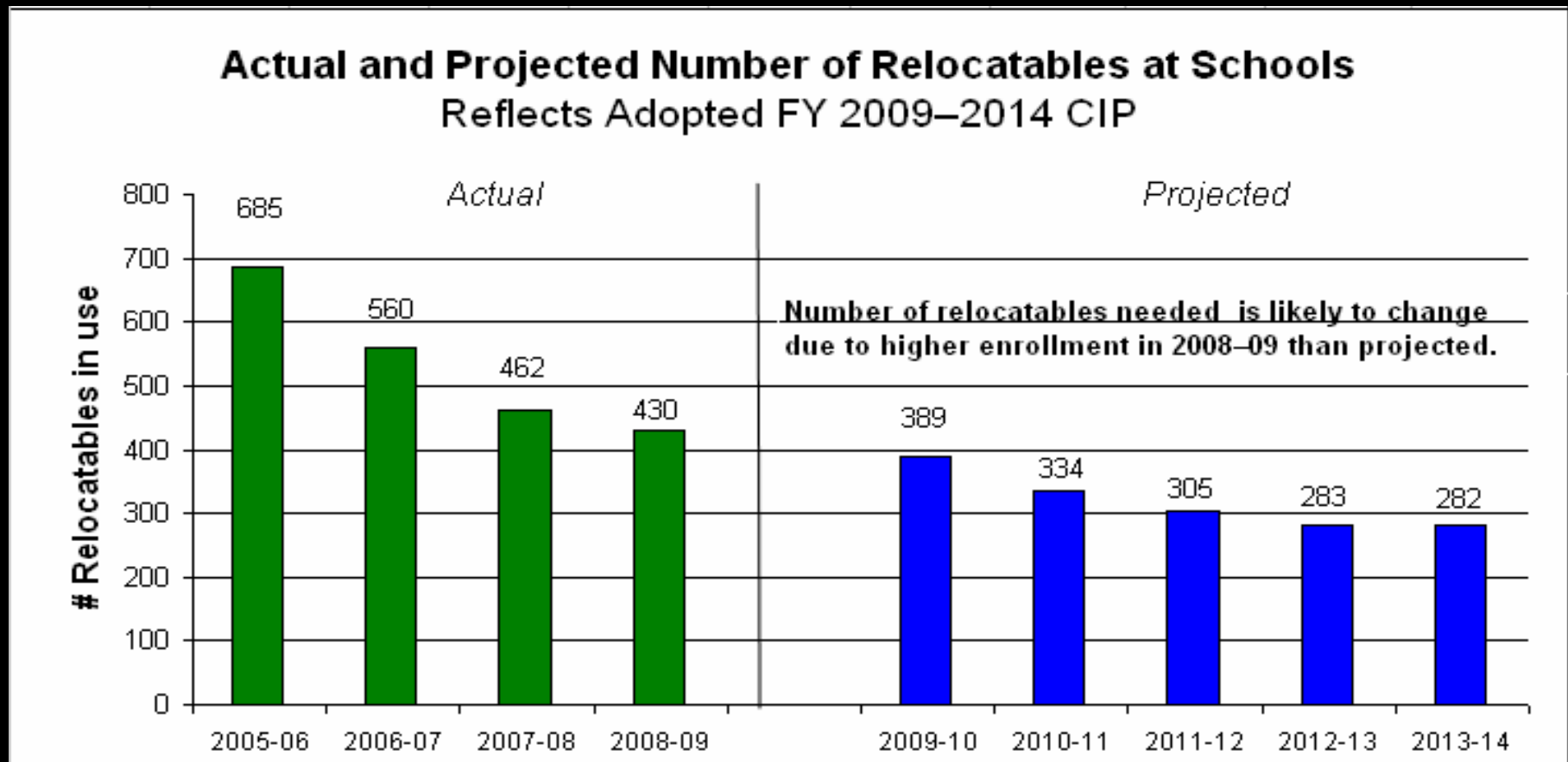

# CIP Issues: Amendments

## Amendment Criteria for CIP:

- Urgent school capacity need
- Urgent public safety concern
- Leveraging of state aid involved
- Inflationary increase above 2.5% in projects that address school capacity
- Inflationary increases above 2.5% in modernizations and other projects

# CIP Issues

## CIP Funding Sources

## Sources of Revenue

- Bonds – Determined by Spending Affordability Guidelines (SAG)
- School Impact Tax – Tax collected at time of building permit for each new dwelling unit constructed. Can only be used for school capacity projects.
- School Facilities Payments – Paid in clusters over 105% utilization. Must be used within the cluster.
- State Aid – Determined by state formula based on projects in approved CIP.
- Current Revenue – The same funding source as the operating budget. May only be used for certain types of projects (e.g., technology, relocatables, and facility planning studies.)
- Recordation Tax – A portion of the tax collected when a residential property is transferred to a new owner. This is a current revenue source that also can only be used for certain projects.
